LATEST NEWS BY WIRE AND MAIL

NEW YORK, Aug. 14.—A copyright despatch to the World from Juneau, Alaska, August 3, by steamship Islander, to Victoria, B. C., says: "There is much of several kinds of trouble ahead on the trail to Dawson City. It looks as if the Canadian customs officials, will have an opportunity to report back to their government that they are unable to collect customs duties without reinforcements. All the incoming gold hunters are incensed at the duty. The rougher element is intemperate in its language and has made threats to ignore the customs officers, peaceably if possible, but forcibly if necessary."

LONDON, Aug. 14.—The Pall Mall Gazette yesterday, in the course of a long article on the increasing activity of the Carlists, says it is not generally known that London is one of the strongholds of the Carlists, thousands of active followers of the Spanish throne being located in this city. The Pall Mall Gazette adds:

"Their leader seems to think that the fall of Canovas brings their opportunity nearer. During the past week they have held many meetings to discuss the best means of assisting their colleagues in Spain in the event of a rising occurring."

The Chevalier Lumby, head of the Carlists club, during an interview, is quoted as saying: "The Carlists are highly organized throughout Spain. When Don Carlos next lands nothing but foreign interference will prevent him from reaching the throne. There are ten thousand volunteers in England ready to fight for him."

WASHINGTON, Aug. 14.—A statement prepared at the Bureau of Statistics shows that the value of goods imported into Canada and again exported into the United States during the past year, subject to the 10 per cent. discriminating duty under the recent opinion of the attorney general was \$1,960,740. In 1894 (the latest at present obtainable) the value of foreign goods coming into the United States through Canada under consular seal was about \$6,000,000. The question of the assessment of the 10 per cent. discriminating duty on this class of goods is now under consideration.

NEW YORK, Aug. 14.—Wheat values yesterday tumbled two cents from the previous night's close, and three cents from the previous day's high point of 90 1/2 cents for September. The decline was attended by heavy unloading of flour wheat.

POLICE COURT.—At the Police Court this morning a charge of assault and battery brought by a woman against her husband was discharged. The offense was committed last December and since that time the wife has changed her mind and refused to prosecute. Two drunks were fined \$2 or 10 days each. Summonses returnable on Wednesday have been issued for two young men who were acting in a disorderly manner on the street on the 7th inst. On Saturday Thomas Clarke was committed to jail for an infraction of the C. T. A. This is one of the old commitments, and we understand the other offenders are being sought for.
