'Centre' Repair Blitz Underway

Repairs are being made to the Confederation Centre in advance of the large influx of Island visitors expected this summer. F. J. Storey, general manager, pleads the "indulgence" of the public for our present messy condition, but says the work will soon be finished.

"After the severe winter some frost heaves developed here and there", he explained, "and with several hundred thousand visitors expected during late June, July and August, it was necessary to perform a 'blitz' job of repairs."

"It is expected that the workmen will finish cleaning the walls of the entrance to the box-office putting an end to the main inconvenience," he added.

The Memorial Hall plaza, the main entrance to the building is being re-surfaced and extra lights are being installed there. Mild weather was necessary for this job.

Liquor Selling Fine Imposed

A man was remanded by consent to June 18 on a charge of being intoxicated in a public place.

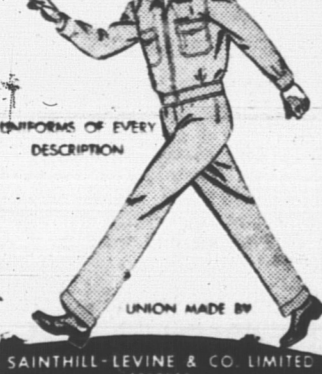
Impaired Fine Is Levied On Town Resident
