

New Angle Crops Up In Printing Bureau Debate

OTTAWA (CP) — Conservative Richard Bell suggested Friday that Edmond Cloutier, Queen's Printer, may have been in contempt of Parliament when he wrote Montreal architect Ernest Cormier Aug. 8 defending printing bureau construction.

At that time, said the member of the Ottawa suburban riding of Carleton, the whole question of printing bureau construction costs was before the Commons public accounts committee. It was a question of whether Mr. Cloutier should have written such a letter.

"Don't you think that is contempt of Parliament?" he asked Mr. Cloutier who sat rather nervously, facing a two-hour barrage of committee questioning.

Mr. Cloutier did not reply and later Mr. Bell again pressed for a reply, saying it was "only fair" that the \$18,000-a-year official be given a chance to comment. Mr. Cloutier remained silent. J. W. Pickersgill (L-Bonavista-Twillingate) came to his rescue.

"I think that is a highly improper question. Mr. Cloutier is being asked to express an opinion about law. He is not a lawyer."

Mr. Cloutier readily agreed he had written the letter expressing satisfaction that the \$16,200,000 plant had been set out to provide a maximum of efficiency at a minimum of effort. He had written it at the request of Mr. Cormier and had visited him two days ago at Montreal to get some figures straightened out on construction costs.

"You were discussing the matters which are being discussed here?" asked John Drysdale (PC-Burnaby-Richmond). Mr. Cloutier said he had. The reason was he wanted to check on figures involved in changes he had ordered in construction. These changes had amounted to \$210,000. The figures by themselves didn't mean anything to him.

Earlier, the 64-year-old Queen's Printer who retires next November said he was not brought into the picture in development of early post-war plans for a printing bureau. He had "no recollections" of any early building estimates ranging from \$2,300,000 in 1946 to \$6,000,000 in 1948.

He agreed that the air conditioning system planned by Mr. Cormier and installed despite works department criticism was faulty. Employees had set up a barrage of complaints.

He agreed also that he had informed Mr. Cormier at the outset not to worry about the criticism; that there always were some employees who complained. But later he urged the works department to make changes. Mr. Cormier had paid him a visit and suggested corrections could be made with the addition of some new equipment. But Mr. Cloutier wasn't sure what Mr. Cormier meant. The Queen's Printer was not an engineer.

Will Address Provincial C.W.L. Convention Here

A native of Milltown, N.B., Miss Coughlin was a teacher in the public schools of New Brunswick previous to being engaged as teacher of academic subjects at the Carleton County Vocational School, Woodstock, N.B. - the first vocational school in Eastern Canada. Miss Coughlin received her education in the Milltown Schools, Teachers' College, Columbia University, N.Y. This talented lady is also the author of a textbook widely used in Canadian schools - "Exercises in Everyday English for Canadians."

Miss Coughlin has also found time to take an active part in the Children's Aid Society of Carleton County, in the Woodstock Branch of the Canadian Red Cross Society, and has served on the Advisory Board of the Canadian National Institute for the Blind and the local V.O.N. Board.

She was awarded the Queen's Coronation Medal on August 3, 1958, was the recipient of the Pro Ecclesia et Pontifice Medal which is emblematic of papal honors bestowed on members of the hierarchy for their notable and praiseworthy service to the Church. Miss Coughlin holds the distinction of having organized the first Provincial Council of the C.W.L. in New Brunswick in 1947 and of having been its first President for three years. She was elected to the National Executive Council at the Convention held in Halifax, and has served as National Convener of Press and later National Convener of Education.

IRAN SHAKEN TEHRAN, Iran (Reuters)—Tremors continued to rock Western Iran Thursday. The series of quakes started during the weekend.
