Low, Pleasant Voices. In view of the importance which the sayings and speeches of emperors and empresses and of kings and queens, it has often been a matter of surprise that so little should have been written about the voices of royal personages. There are two which are especially remarkable for their clear and penetrating tones—namely, those of Queen Victoria and of Empress Elizabeth. The latter invariably speaks very slowly and very softly. It is almost a whisper and yet every word is clear and reaches the ears of people standing even at a distance. It is a voice that goes right through those who hear it. There is no consciousness of an affectation of superiority, no trace of command in it, and yet it impresses itself on the mind of every man who is born to command, not only by reason of her imperial rank but also by what has been described as the "supremacy of her feminine charms." Queen Victoria's voice is entirely different. It is much more silvery and ringing, although it resembles a different kind of lip language in carrying very far without any apparent effort. There is likewise the same clear enunciation of every word; nothing is lost over, and the words are so clearly articulated that Britons are accustomed to talk of "Queen's English" as constituting what is best in their language. Thus on one occasion, when she was in the presence of the Prince of Wales and the other speakers were obliged almost to shout to make themselves heard, Queen Victoria's voice entirely lacks that species of harsh guttural tone and accent which is so remarkable in the voice of the Prince of Wales and of his brothers and sisters.

Care of Table Linen. Never put table linen into soapuds until it has had all stains removed by pouring boiling water through them. This will remove all stains but iron rust. For that soak in a weak solution of oxalic acid, wetting the spot with cold water. Rub gently between the hands, and it will gradually disappear. If obstinate, repeat the process. Table linen should be rubbed lightly. Blue lightly, but do not starch too much. Stiffness of linen is an abomination. Never allow tablecloths to hang on the line in a strong wind. The hems will become frayed, and the new padding will be blown away, and a general limpness be the result. Nothing is so wearing to all linen and cotton cloth as "switching" in the wind from a clothes-line.
