

Liberal Levels Charge of Hillcrest Patronage

With his attention centred on those he described as "the four millionaires of Summerside," Alex B. Campbell, Summerside attorney, in a political address last night, on behalf of the Liberal party, developed the theme that political patronage is linked closely to the projects conducted by Hillcrest Housing Ltd.

In identifying his targets, Mr. Campbell said: "The four millionaires as I shall call them, are the owners of Hillcrest."

FIGURES IDENTIFIED

"They include the provincial minister of health, the provincial minister of welfare and labor, a former president of the Progressive Conservative Association in P.E.I., and an architect whose presence often has been noted at many of the so-called turning ceremonies involving federal and provincial projects."

His disclosures were in obvious reference to Hon. Dr. Herbert McNeill, Hon. Henry Wedger, W. Chester, and Mac Donald, attorney; and G. Keith Pickard, architect.

"One of the Hillcrest Housing people referred to, declined comment on what Mr. Campbell's remarks, as he said it is a private com-

New Drive-In Theatre Taking Shape In Alberton District

ALBERTON — The construction of the Princess Pat drive-in is progressing favorably and present plans are to have the modern up to date theatre in operation early in July.

The site for the theatre is situated for Prince Edward Island if not for all of Canada. The cinema scope screen will be only a few yards from the waters of Cascumpec Bay affording a marvellous view for patrons of the open air theatre which when completed will accommodate 300 cars.

The topographical survey was carried out in the early spring and the Hayes Paving Company is levelling the site and forming the circular ramps. The screen tower, 87 by 40 feet will be supported by 16 posts, 87 feet high reinforced by steel and cement and must be able to withstand a wind velocity of 115 miles per hour.

For the new housing units, a bid later announced that the units would go to Hillcrest.

This decision, he said, will cost the tax payers of Summerside a needless expenditure of one-quarter of a million dollars.

"One thing is certain," he said, "The minister's decision against the Summerside tax payer and in favor of the few, would not have been made without the recommendation of the local member, and for this Dr. Phillips must take the full responsibility."

POSES QUESTION

Mr. Campbell said: "I ask you why has such a project, involving five and three-quarter million dollars, been kept so quiet by the Conservative party spokesmen?"

"Dr. Phillips tells you that he did not have a picture of Hillcrest sent him to me and I will give him the one which appears on page two of the prospectus of Hillcrest Housing Limited, prepared in August, 1961."

Mr. Campbell continued.

In this prospectus, he added, the Minister of national defence has entered into a lease with Hillcrest whereby the department undertakes to rent the units for a period guaranteeing full occupancy for 30 years.

Referring to representations made by the Town of Summerside and the village of St. Eleazar for location on their properties of 275 new housing units, representing two and three-quarter million dollars, which was finally awarded to the Hillcrest.

He said that on August 30, 1961, the Town of Summerside was advised that architects, planners and mortgage officers of Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation were prepared to proceed with the planning of 275 units on the old airport property.
