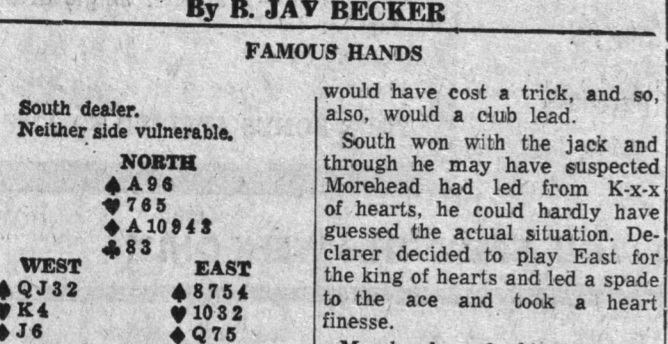

Doctors See Possible Link Between Beer and Cancer

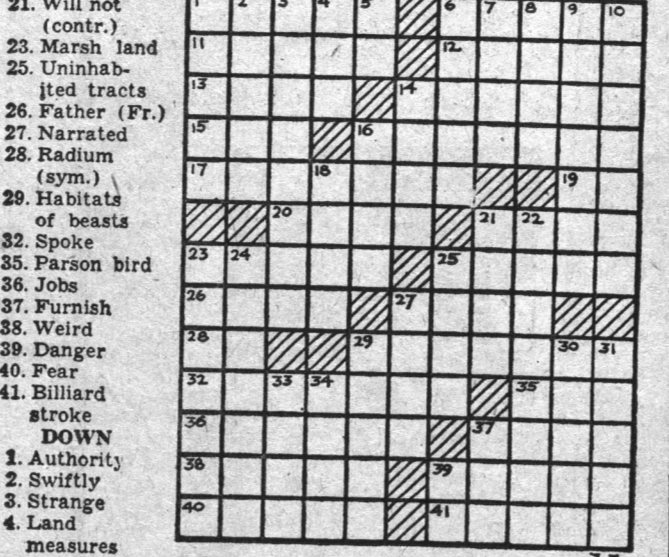
LONDON (Reuters)—Men who drink a lot of beer may be more prone to cancer than teetotalers, says a British medical survey published Tuesday.
Men with a long record of daily tipping were found to have intestinal cancer more often than those who drank little or no beer. Lung cancer also was found more frequently among beer drinkers—smokers and non-smokers—but the report suggested the incidence of lung cancer among non-smoking beer drinkers may be the result of inhaling somebody else's tobacco smoke in a stuffy bar.
The report of a five-year study carried out by Dr. Percy Stocks for the Empire-Cancer Campaign concludes that "among men, frequent beer drinking is associated with a higher incidence of lung cancer and also of other cancer, except in the stomach."
FOOD, CIGARET EFFECTS
Dr. Stocks examined hospital patients in the west midlands of England, north Wales and the Isle of Man—a region with a population of 2,500,000 and 7,000 cancer cases annually.
He took note of factors like smoking and eating habits along with beer drinking in his survey. He defined "heavy beer drinkers" as men who drank beer daily for 20 years or more and "heavy

Dosco Plans To Go Ahead With Montreal Steel Mill

TORONTO (CP)—Dominion Steel and Coal Corporation Ltd. intends "to proceed at the appropriate time with construction of a cold-rolling mill in the Montreal area," says the current letter to shareholders of A. V. Roe Canada Ltd.
The letter—signed by Crawford Gordon, president of Roe and of Dosco—says the development "will enable Dosco to enter for the first time the important and expanding Canadian market for cold-rolled steel products and prepare the way for a general strengthening and broadening of Dosco operations."
A site of 1,000 acres east of Montreal has been bought for the purpose.
The letter does not state the cost of the proposed mill, but it is understood that it will be in the neighborhood of \$25,000,000. ENLARGE MARKET?
It will, presumably, offer an enlarged market for the output of Dosco steel operations at Sydney, N.S.
Cold-rolled steel products include sheets for automobile bodies, refrigerators and similar items.

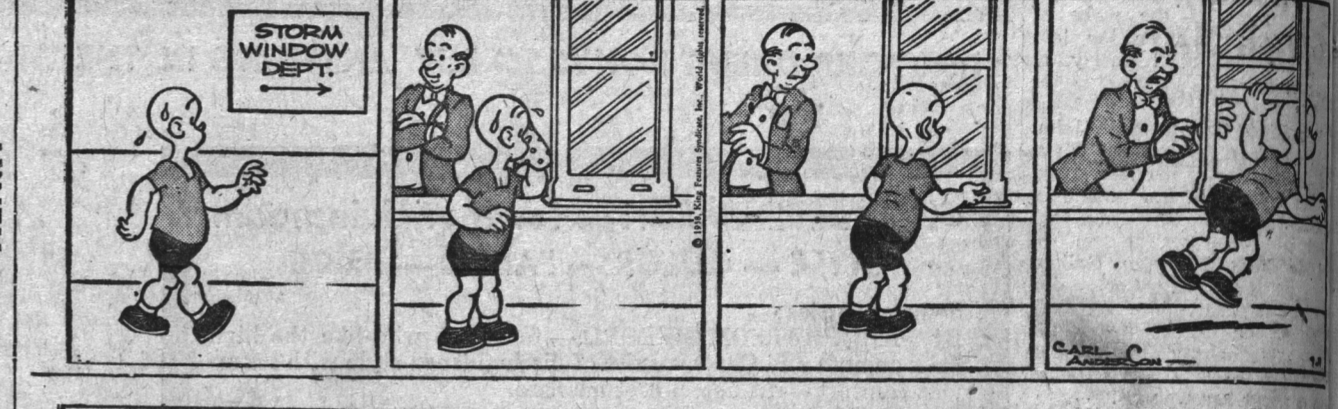
