Junior Farmers and Junior Club News

A meeting of the Tracadie Junior Farmers' Group was held in the Parish Hall, Feb. 8th. George MacDonald, president, occupied the chair and conducted the meeting in an efficient manner.

A letter received from the Vocational School dealing with agricultural short courses was read by the secretary, William Lund. There was also considerable discussion re the debating competition being sponsored by the Junior Farmers' Federation.

The meeting spoke in favor of entering this competition, and arrangements were made for another debate to be held at their next meeting, in two weeks' time. Mr. M. MacDougal and Miss Marion Smith were chosen for the leaders in the debate: "Resolved That Country Life Is Better Than City Life." Isaac Tuplin and Morris Deacon, fieldmen with the Department of Agriculture were present.

A brief talk was given by Mr. Deacon on the agricultural course at the Vocational School and on a radio project being planned by the Department of Agriculture and Junior Farmers' Federation. A committee of William Lund and Reggie MacDonald was appointed to contact the members re this radio project, which is being purchased in conjunction with the Sodality of the Virgin Mary. Eight more members indicated their desire to join the group, which brings the total to 22.

A debate was held: "Resolved that in this community horsepower should be replaced by mechanical power." The leader of the "pro" side was George MacDonald, supported by Reggie MacKinnon, and the leader of the "con" side was William Lund. The other supporters were absent. Rev. Father Phalen acted as critic, and the judges were Mr. Tunlin and Mr. Deacon, who gave the verdict in favor of the Con side.

Pictures were shown by Mr. Tuplin on "Farmers For the Future", and "Parliamentary Practice".

A meeting of the directors of the Prince Edward Island Junior Farmers' Federation was held Saturday afternoon, Feb. 2nd. The directors present were: Ronny McInnis, Edward Pierson, Merlon MacDonald, Urban Laughlin, Keith Moase, Heather Coles, Anne Keefe, Bernice McLaugh, Lucille Wood, and Scott MacArthur.

Also present were: W. R. Shaw, Deputy Minister of Agriculture, and S. D. Peacock, fieldman. A committee was appointed to select the winner of the Patriot Publishing Company Trophy. This trophy is given to the Junior Farmers' group making the most progress in the year. It was again decided to sponsor a debating competition, open to rural groups all over the Island.

The deadline for applications was set for February 29th. Other projects suggested for this year were local area tours and a class for potatoes at the Rural Youth Fair.

The annual meeting of the Bear River Avshire Club was held in the Bear River South School, January 30, 1952. There was a large attendance, of which sixteen joined the club.

The new secretary for the coming year of 1952 is Zeta MacGough; president, Martina Hughes; vice-president, Ruthie Peters. It was decided to have the next meeting on February 14, at the home of Martina H. Hughes. The meeting then adjourned by singing the National Anthem.

MONTREAL, Feb. 15 — (CP) — Imperial Tobacco Company of Canada, Ltd., today reported net profit of \$3,413,642 for the fiscal year ended Dec. 31, 1951, compared with \$6,994,243 for the previous fiscal year.

Net profit per share was 47 cents, compared with 63 1-4 cents last year. Net working capital amounted to \$37,827,913, against \$35,643,068.
