AN OLD MAN named George White was run over and killed by a locomotive at Fredericton, on Saturday last. It is expected that five English agricultural delegates, who are coming out on the invitation of the Minister of Agriculture, will be present at the Dominion Exhibition.

It is reported that His Honor the Lieut. Governor has accepted the invitation of the Mayor of Ottawa, and will be present at the Dominion Exhibition. MISS MACDONALD, of Boston, argued her own case before the United States Circuit Court, in New York, on Saturday last, in a patent suit, being the first lady practitioner who ever appeared in the Court House. THE gold discoveries in Queen's County, Nova Scotia, have created intense excitement in surrounding districts. The consolidated Gold Mining Co. has issued a prospectus for a capital of \$200,000 in 40,000 shares of \$5 each.

CITY COUNCIL.—There was not a quorum last evening—only Councillors Koughan, Byrne, Crabbe and Murphy, being present. It is hinted that some of the remaining Councillors had an ulterior motive in being absent and neglecting civic business. THE steamer Carroll arrived from Boston at 2:30 to-day. On Sunday last divine service was held in the spacious reading-room of the Lorne Hotel. A large number of guests and residents of Tracadie were present, and the Rev. D. Fitzgerald, Rector of St. Paul's Church, Charlottetown, preached a very interesting sermon. This, if continued, will add to the many charming attractions of Lorne Hotel.

THE Patriot says:—"We understand that Lieut. Governor Haviland received from His Excellency the Marquis of Lorne, a handsomely framed and excellently executed likeness of himself and the Princess Louise, accompanied by an autograph letter from His Excellency, in which he spoke gratefully of the Governor's kindness and attention to him while on his visit to the Island."

AT THE Stipendiary Magistrate's Court this forenoon Patrick Brogan, John Bowden, and John Ready were charged with keeping company with a gang of thieves, and also wandering through the city at unreasonable hours of the night. The trio denied the charge in toto, and after giving a brief account of their respective stewardships they were discharged with the warning that if they were again arrested on such a charge they would be imprisoned for three months with hard labor. Ready was further ordered to leave the city within twenty-four hours. He to all appearances thanked the Magistrate for his kindness, and remarked that if he could catch him in the city to-morrow he might imprison him forever.

THE St. John Telegraph, commenting on the proceeding of the Maine Board of Agriculture says:—"The astonishing fact is revealed that the people of Maine are without mills for grinding oats into meal, and scarcely know the taste of food made from that most nutritive and palatable article of food. Still the very surprising fact remains that while all the Maritime Provinces ship oats, and while P. E. Island does so by millions of bushels, they all import some oatmeal, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick doing so in considerable quantities. Last year Nova Scotia imported 742 barrels of oatmeal, and New Brunswick 378 barrels, both Provinces bringing this article mainly from the United States.

THE Patriot charges the Government with being "shabby and mean" in refusing to pay Galbraith's Band for turning out at the meeting of the Legislature, and states that the refusal was given because Mr. Galbraith voted against the Government. Our readers will not be surprised to learn that this, like all other charges of the Patriot, is grossly and maliciously untrue, and the Patriot knows it to be so. Galbraith's Band was not employed on the occasion referred to, neither did Galbraith's Band turn out as such. The Band of the 32d Battalion attended with the Guard of Honor, and Col. A map of the locality, together with plans and specification of the works to be done, can be seen at this office and at the Resident Engineer's office, at St. Anne, on and after SATURDAY, the 27th DAY OF SEPTEMBER next, at either of which places printed forms of tender can be obtained.

Ninety per cent, only of the progress estimates will be paid until the completion of the work.

To each tender must be attached the actual signatures of two responsible and solvent persons, residents of the Dominion, willing to become sureties for the carrying out of these conditions, as well as the due performance of the works embraced in the contract.
