CAMPUS GROUP TAKES ON TASK

A number of UPEI students will stage a conference for Maritime University Chapters of an organization that does not even exist here yet, in mid-January.

The students, under the direction of Rachel Roy, will hold the annual Conference of Maritime Newman Clubs.

The Newman organization is a Roman Catholic oriented group (but without membership restrictions) that attempts to foster Christian action on campuses.

It is a form of "pastoral outreach" under the name of Newman. The society came about when governments began to take colleges over from churches, and chaolains sought ways of continuing their work on the campuses. They were named after John Henry Cardinal Newman, a 19th century Catholic philosopher who devoted much of his life to a theory of the university.

The UPEI students are forming a chapter, and they hope to get off the ground after Christmas, according to Miss Roy.

The whole issue of holding the conference came about as the result of the attendance of some UPEI students at the previous two Maritime gatherings. They were asked to host this years, and agreed.

The goal of the conference will be to promote Christian ideals and action through the media of friendship and the exchange of ideas, with the intent to foster these ideas and actions forcefully on the campuses of participating universities.

Miss Roy says that any students wishing to join the UPEI Newman and/or work on the conference, should drop into the weekly meetings held on Tuesdays at 1 P.M. in the Chapel. There are only a limited number of

spaces available at the conference for UPEI students, Miss Roy advises, and those who wish to attend should get their applications in at the soonest possible moment.
