## Private Force For Viet Nam Turned Down

LONDON (Reuters) - President Johnson has turned down a British businessman's offer to send a private army of 2,000 British volunteers to fight alongside American forces in South Viet Nam, the businessman said Saturday night.

Company Director Paul Daniels, 50, said he had offered the services of a "British volunteer legion" in a letter to President Johnson in August.

He received a reply from the defence department on behalf of Johnson saying they appreciated the desire to help efforts to halt aggression in Southeast Asia. But "under present circumstances, however, active participation by members of the legion would not seem to be desirable."

Daniels said men volunteered for his proposed force after his idea was given publicity on television. He said he now could put 2,300 men in the field.

Earlier this year the British government turned down an offer by Daniels to send his volunteers to serve beside New Zealanders and Australians in a Commonwealth brigade in Viet Nam.

## Bank Offers Post-Graduate Fellowships

TORONTO (CP) - The Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce will provide post-graduate studies for up to 14 Commerce Fellows in four countries to mark the centennial both of Canada and of the bank.

The two-year course, prepared in association with York University, will take the students to Oxford, Harvard and France's Institute for European administration. It will also include a six-week touring seminar covering all of Canada's economic regions.

One student will be chosen from each of the 10 provinces and four other fellowships at large will be appointed.
