GREAT NAVAL DEMONSTRATION.

Meeting of British War Ships in Chinese Waters.

LONDON, Jan. 17.—The whole British squadron is likely to assemble soon at the mouth of the Yang Tse Kiang, in support of Great Britain's assertions in the matter of China.

MONTREAL, Jan. 17.—A number of ward-maids in the Royal Victoria Hospital have gone on strike. The trouble was brought about by what they term the tyrannical treatment of the Lady superintendent.

Death of a Nestor.

LONDON, Jan. 17.—The Right Hon. Charles Pelham Villiers, M. P. for South Walverhampton, known as the "Father of the House of Commons," having sat continuously in the House since 1835, died last night.

A Lady Shoots Herself.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 17.—Mrs. Lucille Lane, daughter of ex-Senator Blackburn, shot herself last night.

Bye-Election in Quebec.

OTTAWA, Jan. 17.—The writ for a bye-election in Quebec centre was issued on Saturday, 15th. Nomination 24th January, polling 31st.

VICTORIA, B. C., Jan. 14.—The steamer City of Seattle left here yesterday for Alaska Port, having on board 600 passengers. The run to the Klondike has fairly begun and in a few weeks a steamer will be leaving every day.

NEW YORK, Jan. 14.—The Herald says that Edison has accidentally discovered what he believes to be a new metal, which will do away with the slow and costly process of making malleable iron. Exhaustive experiments will be made, and if they are successful it is promised that full details will be given to the public.
