## Local and Other Items.

**OLD BANK BILLS.**—Several \$1 and \$2 bills of the Bank of Prince Edward Island are in circulation in Pictou.

**AT SYDNEY.**—Schurman, Lefurgey & Co, Summerside, have secured a contract for the erection of fifty dwellings at Sydney, C. B. This will give that enterprising firm a busy time of it this winter. Carpenters are being sent down there at once with the material to go on with the contract.

**NOVA SCOTIA COAL FIELDS.**—An Ottawa despatch says: Dr. H. M. Ami, who, with Mr. Hugh Fletcher, of the Geological Survey, has been engaged in mapping out the coal field of Nova Scotia, has returned to the city. Dr. Ami says that much valuable work has been done this summer. The areas of known seams have been ascertained to be of greater than heretofore supposed, while many new and extensive areas have been discovered.

**CHICKENS AT SUMMERSIDE.**—The chicken fattening station at Summerside is making good progress, and considerable interest is being taken in it. Mr. A. W. Woodard, of Ottawa, visited the station on Friday last and gave a demonstration as to the proper way to kill, etc., as he did in Charlottetown. He intends returning to Summerside Monday afternoon when the chickens now being fattened—about 275—will be killed and prepared for shipment. At this station fifteen chickens are kept in a coop and the coops have made an average gain of about six pounds per week. A number of chickens have already been received for the next shipment which will consist of 300 fattened by the Government and 400 or 500 fattened on his own account.

**SOME YACHTING INFORMATION.**—It may be interesting just now to recall the fact that in 1895 the Defender won the first race from the Valkyrie by eight minutes and 49 seconds. The second race was won by the Defender. The Valkyrie finished first by 47 seconds, but was disqualified for fouling the Defender. In the third race the Valkyrie withdrew after crossing the line and the Defender finished alone. It may also be well to know that a yacht sails faster with the wind abeam than she does with the wind behind. A yacht will not sail so fast going dead against the wind because she has to go so much further, having to make tacks to get to windward. Very few yachts sail closer than three and a half points into the wind.

**ADVICTO ENDEAVOURERS.**—At Montreal during the closing meeting of the Christian Endeavour dominion convention, Rev. J. A. R. Dickson, of Galt, Ont., in the course of an interesting address "How to Develop Workers," said that the object of the Christian Endeavour society was to develop workers, and the best way to do this was to keep the pledge, but all should endeavor to do so. His great suggestion was, seek to make the members happy in the society. Nothing could be expected of any society where the workers were discontented. Then encouragement should be given, and neither any criticism nor censure. In regard to the courting in Christian Endeavour societies he thought there should be more of it. A Christian Endeavour society contains the cream of the young people of the country, and was the best place from which a young woman could select a husband or a young man a wife. Also, they should have patience and not be in a hurry to see wonders accomplished.

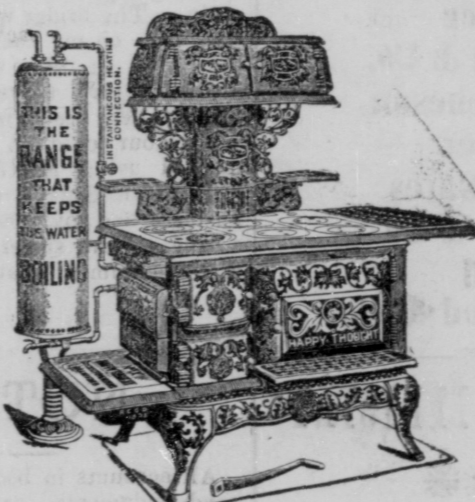
