The Egg Trade—Reply to Auld Brothers. SIR.—In Saturday's Patriot, Messrs. Auld Bros., in a letter evidently intended for political effect, endeavor to show that out of a total export of \$309,000 worth of eggs from P. E. Island, the loss to the province under the operation of the McKinley tariff would amount to more than half of the total export, or \$160,000. There is no one better aware of the fallacy of their calculations than Auld Bros. themselves. They are not unacquainted with the fact that the passage of the McKinley Bill was followed by prompt advances in the price of all dutiable products, and that notwithstanding the annually increasing receipts from the Western States, eggs reached a higher price in Boston in December, 1890, than for several years prior to the passage of that Act—showing conclusively that the consumer has paid the greatest part, if not the whole duty. Auld Bros. have paid 20 cents per doz for eggs since the imposition of the 5 cents duty—as high a price, probably, as they have given for eggs for several years. After testing the English market by actual shipment, they admit that prices in London are better than in Boston or New York, which effectually sets aside the first part of their contention that the duty would prove a loss to the Province—unless, perchance, their love for the Americans is so strong that they are willing to ship to the States at a loss rather than take advantage of better markets. I could go into this egg question much more largely, but knowing the scarcity of your space, I write thus briefly. L. P. TANTON, March 2, 1891.

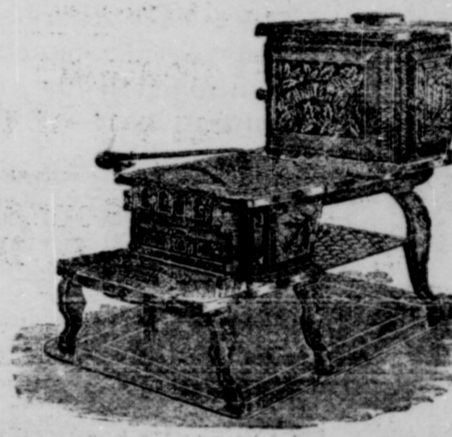
