As the result of an accident on March 7, Mr. Wallace Steele is a patient in the Souris Hospital. Friends all wish him a speedy recovery.



The Sainte Adresse, owned by Capt. J. H. Blackmore of Port Union, Nfld., entered St. John's today with a broken air compressor. She was expected to leave again in the evening.
