Though Luke stands out as one of the greatest literary men of all time, the Bible tells us but little about him. He has been described as the "beloved physician," who is assumed to be the author of both the Gospel which bears his name and the Book of Acts. He was a careful historian with a vigorous literary style. He speaks of "having a perfect understanding of all things from the very first." He had a sense of the universality of Christ's mission, and emphasized the compassion, charity, prayerfulness and tenderness of Our Lord.

Yank Looks At Canadian Flag Debate WASHINGTON (CP)—An American looking at the 1964 Canadian flag debate says it "underlined not only some major facets of public dissensus in Canada but also the often-imperfect gropings of the political parties to come to terms with it." He says the crux of the debate was the "inclusion or omission of traditional French or English symbols", not the color or the number of maple leaves. "Canadian party cohesion normally is strong, dropping off mostly in those rare instances when a party group is struck by a major English-French issue division. This was one such issue." "The Liberals appealed both their wings adequately... the Conservatives failed to make such an accommodation..." Dr. Albinski says one upshot is that "minor political parties

have become a definite political fixture. "Regional strength is shifting. Conservatives have become entrenched in the Prairies and Liberals are dominating the erstwhile Conservative strength of Ontario. Liberals have resumed their traditional (federal) ascendancy over Conservatives in Quebec but must contend with a resurgence of militant French-Canadian politics."

Feb. Truce May Be Out

DALAT, South Vietnam (AP)—Premier Nguyen Cao Ky said here he may scall off the four-day truce scheduled for the Vietnamese new year in February. He claimed the Viet Cong probably won't want to observe it. Speaking to reporters at this mountain resort city, Ky said it was too late to change the 48-hour ceasefire over the western new year, which is scheduled to start Saturday. "But," he said, "if the Viet Cong continue their violations, the government will have to revise its proposal for the Tet (lunar new year) ceasefire, which we ourselves suggested."

Coca-Cola Plans Price Increase

TORONTO (CP)—Coca-Cola Ltd., has announced it will increase the wholesale price of soft drinks by one per cent Jan. 1 when an increased federal sales tax goes into effect. The company was unable to say how the increase will affect retail prices. But it will mean about two cents more on the wholesale price of a case of 24 bottles.
