Mgr. Bourdages, a member of the relief committee, said that except for a \$10,000 contribution from the Quebec government and a \$2,000 gift from Gaspe's Archbishop Paul Bernier, donations have been few and small.

The parish priest said many of the 54 homeless settlers in the area are in real need.

Violence Hits In Caracas

CARACAS, Venezuela (AP) — An explosive wave of violence against the government swept downtown Caracas Tuesday. Rebellious rioters fought an hour-long series of battles with police and troops.

Four persons were killed. Two were policemen and one was a

civilian trampled to death under a crowd scattering before a police charge. Thirty-six persons were reported wounded.

At nightfall, while police continued fights with rioters, crowds broke shop windows in the Simon Bolivar section of the city. The government hastily suspended constitutional guarantees in an effort to check the sudden surge of violence.

The government blamed the rioting on professional agitators, charging the agitators took over a workers' demonstration for their own ends.

THROW STONES
Some unarmed rioters fought police with stones grabbed from a street under construction near downtown government buildings and hurled them at the Parliament building.

They moved on police headquarters but were driven back by gunfire and tear gas.

President Romulo Betancourt called an emergency session of his cabinet. The leaders of all of Venezuela's political parties arrived to confer with the president.

Armed cars were drawn up around Miraflores Palace, where the president's offices are located. The rioting began as a protest against a government decree forbidding the construction of more shacks on the hills surrounding this tropical city. The government has declared the hills to be park areas in an effort to prevent the construction of shack towns.

OTTAWA (CP) — Canada has decided to launch a major oceanographic research program on its Atlantic and sub-Arctic coasts to assess sea-bed resources and obtain information for anti-submarine defences.

The work will be centered in a \$8,000,000 oceanographic institute to be built at Bedford Basin, near Halifax.

The institute, to be known as the Bedford Institute of Oceanography, will be completed by late 1964. It will have a staff of some 300 oceanographers, hydrographers, submarine geologists and an operating fleet of 10 oceanographic vessels.

Mines Minister Comtois said Tuesday the institute's job will be to study the physical characteristics of the sea bed and waters off the Atlantic and sub-Arctic coasts.

"The resultant data is needed for anti-submarine defences and to ascertain the resource potential of the country's continental

shelf in these regions and to assist navigation," he said in a statement.

"In the face of the growing danger of ballistic missile-carrying submarines, a detailed knowledge of the characteristics of the water and the sea bed is necessary for the development and operation of adequate instruments of detection."

LITTLE ABOUT COAST
Mr. Comtois said Canada has the longest coastline of any country in the world, but possesses little knowledge of its coastal waters.

Oceanography, he said, has been a neglected science in Canada, mainly because of the size of the job to be done and the high cost of this type of work.

During the last session of Parliament, the Commons mines committee strongly criticized the former Liberal government's record in this field.

The Atlantic and sub-Arctic sections of the Canadian hydrogra-

phic service will be transferred to Bedford Basin when the new institute is completed. The institute will house the Atlantic regional office of the geological survey of Canada and will be the headquarters of a polar group which will conduct a broad program of research on the rim of the Arctic basin.

Liberals Claim Exaggeration

QUEBEC (CP) — The Montmagny Association of Young Liberals has issued a statement describing as "grossly exaggerated" a charge by Quebec Solicitor Antoine Rivard Sunday about an alleged dancing and drinking session at an Ile-aux-Grues Church.

Mr. Rivard said in a speech at the opening of a new bridge at Montmagny that a picnic staged by Young Liberals July 25

was marked by "sacrilegious" incidents and provincial police were ordered to investigate.

The statement by Young Liberals from Montmagny said: "There were some regrettable incidents at Ile-aux-Grues but Mr. Rivard's statements... for the most part are the result of a fertile imagination."

"We made an investigation which indicated... no reprehensible act was committed by any member of our association. "Some youths, well-known supporters of Mr. Rivard, joined the group and stirred up trouble and disorder."

"Our investigation shows that later in the day two youths, not members of our association, went to St. Antoine church... but there was no rock 'n' roll, no dancing, no holy water spilled on the floor as Mr. Rivard... affirmed."

"The church is two miles from the picnic grounds and it was impossible for the officers and members of the association to exercise constant control over every member of the group."
