Despite differences in color, in race and in outlook nowhere in this wide Empire are people with warmer hearts and truer faithfulness to their friends than the inhabitants of that colony. For, once, can never forget them. To me—black, brown or white—they were always kind. As the days go by the memories which gleam with the brightness of their stars are the memories of their countless acts of generosity and of love. It is surely these things which bind us closer to one another, and in the long run are a pledge and a guarantee of the permanence and unity of our common Empire.

Messrs Grey and MacLean, a usual played their part well in their elaborate representation of a Mexican and a Spanish Pirate respectively.

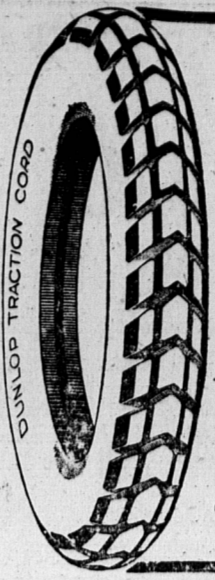
