**£500 REWARD.**

WHEREAS I have received information that on the night of SATURDAY, the 27th MAY last, a Barn and Stable, of JOHN ARCHIBALD McDONALD, ESQUIRE, situate at GLENALADALE, on Township Number 36, were CONSUMED BY FIRE, and that there is strong reason to believe that the said buildings were wilfully and feloniously set on fire by some person, or persons, at present undiscovered.

Now, therefore, in order to the discovery and punishment of the party, or parties, guilty of the aforesaid felonious offence, I have thought fit, by and with the advice and consent of Her Majesty's Council, to proclaim, and I do hereby proclaim and offer a reward of

**FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS,**

to any person, or persons, not the actual party to the act, who will give such information and evidence as will lead to the discovery, apprehension and conviction of the offender, or offenders.

**Newfoundland—South-East Coast,  
LIGHTS AT CAPE RACE AND CAPE PINE.**

INFORMATION has been received at the Admiralty, that it has been decided to make the following changes in the lights at Cape Race and Cape Pine, on the south-east coast of Newfoundland, viz.:—

The fixed light at Cape Race to be altered to a revolving white light, attaining its greatest brilliancy every half minute.

The revolving light at Cape Pine to be altered to a fixed white light.

It is expected that these changes may take place some time in August 1865, but the precise date, with further information, will be published in a subsequent Notice.
