NEW YORK (AP) — A new proposal for rail mergers brought sharp moves to the issues involved Wednesday but the stock market as a whole was mixed.

The Dow Jones industrial average rose 50 to 893.60 while the Dow Jones stock composite slipped 36 to 314.62.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks rose 5 to 332.9 with industrials up 9 rails up 2 and utilities up 3.

Among Canadian issues, Dome Mines and Hudson Bay Mining each were up 1/2.

Toronto Manager Frewin Wants Argos In Exhibition

Bob Frewin made what he described as "a subjective appraisal" and stated flatly that Toronto Rifles in the newly-formed Continental Football League could give any Canadian Football League team "trouble" if they ever met. He paused briefly and added:

"At this time I'd say we'd beat Toronto Argonauts. Mind you, we aren't itching to play them and we didn't start out in life to deride them or the Canadian Football League, but I think it is inescapable that we'll meet Argos in an exhibition game."

"You can't evade the fact that Toronto football fans sooner or later will demand this game. If this comes about, and if Argos received permission from their league and we got clearance from ours, we'd play with the stipulation that neither team would gain financially from it, that all proceeds go to some worthwhile charity."

"I think it would raise \$100,000."

"From the games I've seen in our league, I'd have to say that we have harder tackling and blocking than you see in the Canadian league." Frewin said in an interview.

"We've got greater bench depth than the Canadian teams because we have more American football players. We aren't limited to 14 Americans as in the Canadian league."

high schools and most colleges than the Canadians get in this country, so it follows that we have really good bench strength and that's where we might be able to wear down teams in the Canadian league."

LIKE AMERICAN RULES
A "big difference" between the two leagues is that the Canadian league has more "sneaky players" such as halfback Willie Fleming and quarter Joe Kapp of British Columbia's Lions, quarters Bernie Faloney of Montreal Alouettes and Kenny Ploien of Winnipeg Blue Bombers.

"But our teams have big, strong, tough lines. There are linemen in our league up to 280 pounds and they're all bruisers."

There is no doubt that the Rifles, who play strictly U.S. rules, have captured the imagination of Toronto fans.

Frewin has received about 300 letters. "Every one offered congratulations or good wishes and many wrote about American rules, particularly the fair catch or ground the ball on."
