Opium Seizure Made in Turkey

ROME (AP) — United States narcotics agents have reported they helped Turkish police seize 1,614 pounds of opium, enough to bring American dope pushers \$7,500,000.

The U.S. agents said 254 pounds of opium had been confiscated at Meye, 80 miles from Izmir, July 13. The agents said this was the biggest seizure in which they had participated in this area since starting Mediterranean operations 24 years ago.

July 8, the U.S. agents said, another 110 pounds of opium was seized at Bolvadin, Turkey, after a gun battle.

The American agents, who have their headquarters here, said three Turks were arrested at Bolvadin but that several escaped in the gun fight.

At Meye, two Turks, believed to have shipped tons of opium to European markets for conversion into heroin, were reported arrested.

The agents said the 1,614 pounds of opium seized at Meye and Bolvadin could have provided 185 pounds of heroin.

The quantity, the agents said, could have been sold to U.S. wholesalers for \$700,000 and eventually to American narcotic law addicts for \$7,500,000.

WANTS CONSULTATION

LONDON (Reuters) — The British government wants to be consulted about formation of a political union in Europe, a foreign office spokesman said Sunday. The spokesman said this point is being made in exchanges with European Community member countries. French President de Gaulle and West German Chancellor Adenauer agreed earlier to continue efforts to unite Europe politically without waiting for British entry in the ECSC.

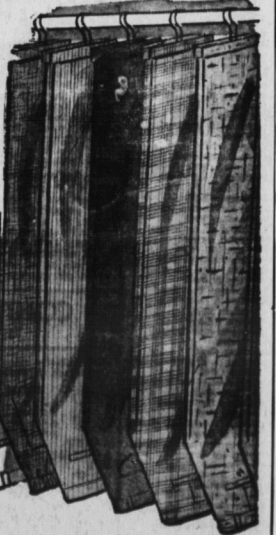
