TORONTO (CP)—Dr. Franklin H. Top of Iowa City, Iowa, says in a report published by the Health League of Canada that farmers who don't observe rest periods throughout the day are susceptible to farm accidents.

Among major industries, farming has the third-highest accidental-death rate Dr. Top says. The high level of work accidents is partially due to a shift from horse-drawn to motor-driven machinery, allowing less chance for a rest.

Studies disclosed a peak mid-morning and mid-afternoon period during which most accidents occur. A rest period at such times was advisable.

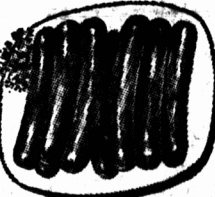

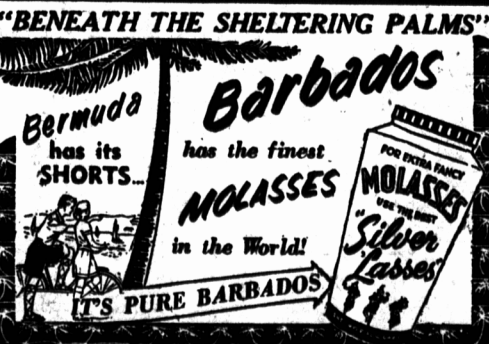
