

Expect Early Opening Of Souris Fish Meal Plant

Building has commenced at Souris for the housing of a modern fish meal and fish oil plant that will process offalls from cod, haddock and whole body fish from herring, caplin and similar fish. It is hoped that the plant will be complete and in operation early in December as the caplin catch will be available until the end of February. It is expected that these fish will be purchased and processed until that time.

It is the intention of those interested to process herring for fish meal and fish oil. The herring will be available from the Egmont Bay district, supplemented by further quantities from the Magdalen Islands.

Heigi H. Zoega of Iceland, who is associated with Albert Griffin in this expansion of the fishing industry in Souris, has purchased the home formerly owned by Arthur McQuaid, and is now residing there with his family.

Mr. Zoega was instrumental in bringing to the province Andre Jesson, also of Iceland, who arrived at Wood Islands yesterday with the object of investigating the future possibilities for processing and packing herring in a variety of ways to meet the requirements of Canadian, United States and European markets.

After a thorough investigation, Mr. Zoega is convinced that there is probably more herring in the North Bay (Gulf of St. Lawrence) than in the North Sea.

Thanks to the successful efforts of Mr. Griffin in securing the interest of these men who rate high in the development of the fish industry in their own country, the probability of considerable success in the venture at Souris is encouraging.

August Fish Landings Up

OTTAWA, (CP) — Canada's sea fishermen landed 261,453,000 pounds of fish in August, a catch worth \$13,824,000.

The bureau of statistics reporting this Wednesday said the August sea catch was up 10.3 per cent over the 236,962,000 pounds landed in August, 1953. The value was up 20.7 per cent over the \$11,453,000 value of the August, 1953, catch.

The August figures brought sea fish landings to 1,251,657,000 pounds in the January-August period this year compared with 1,101,000,000 pounds in the first eight months of 1953.

The cumulative value rose to \$56,419,000 from \$55,479,000.

East coast landings rose to 206,173,000 pounds in August from 171,994,000 in August last year and the value as \$8,129,000 compared with \$5,228,000.

Pacific coast landings in August dropped to 55,280,000 from 64,959,000 pounds because of a tendermen's strike which tied the industry up for a week. Nevertheless
