

Hockey Revivial?

The Christmas Break proved very beneficial to the Hockey Panthers as a revamped lineup proved successful.

Before the break for Christmas, the Panthers were in the arms of a bad losing streak. After starting the season with 2wins and 1tie in three games, disaster struck as they managed to pick up only one point in their last four games. One thing happened in that stretch that seldom happens to the Panthers; they lost one game and tied another on home ice against a team from U.N.B. The next weekend, the Saint Mary Huskies and Acadia Axemen proved uncooperative hosts as they dropped the Panthers 9-1 and 7-4 respectively.

Vince Mulligan had a heavy task ahead as he had to put together a winning team. His changes proved successful as the Panthers hammered the eighth ranked team in the nation, Moncton Blue Eagles 7-3.

The big changes saw Billy Weatherbie move to center on a line with Tom Hayward and Shawn McIsaac. This line was the hottest on Sunday as they hit for four goals, two by McIsaac, with singles going to Weatherbie and Hayward.

Another change saw Louie Doherty playing on left wing with Michael Paiement and Claude Lambert.

The only line that resisted change was the Gordie Beck, Eugene Power and Jerry Kelly line.

The two big reasons for success were the plays of goaltender Gui Desaulnier and Connie Murnaghan. After playing in a disasterous game against St. Mary's, Desaulnier made tremendous saves especially in the second period to help keep the Panthers in the lead.

On the blue line Donnie Murnaghan played an outstanding game. Teamed with Donnie Brown, they delivered bone crushing checks and led rush after rush.

Leading 3-0 after the first period, the Panthers slipped and had it not been for the excellent goaltending of Desaulnier the Panthers would not have held a 3-2 lead going into the third period. The Panthers have played good hockey in the third period all season and Sunday's game was no exception as they pounded in four goals before the Blue Eagles rounded out the scoring late in the third period.

The goal scorers for the Panthers were Shawn McIsaac and Claude Lambert with Two apiece, with singles going to Tom Hayward, Bill Weatherbie and Eugene Power.

This weekend the Panthers will try to extend the winning streak as they journey to Fredericton to play two all important games against the Saint Thomas Tommies.

Teacher Certification

The following recommendations approved on December 14, 1972 by our rather amazing Minister of Education, Bennet Cambell. The recommendations were made by the Teacher Certification and Standards

Board, with the effective date of each Policy Change as indicated. This information is being published as an information service to those students in the Education Faculty as well as to any other students who may be interested in the teaching profession:

(1) The certification classification known as License 4 will be phased out by August 31, 1975.

(2) Any teacher teaching on, or holding, a Letter of Authority must qualify for a permanent Certificate by August 31, 1975.

(3) Effective January 1, 1973, no Letters of Authority will be issued by the Department of Education to new applicants.

(4) Effective September 1, 1973, all new applicants for teaching credentials (certificates) must meet the requirements for certificate 4.
