At 19 years of age he moved to England and started his professional wrestling career there. He wrestled in England for 3 1/2 years and captured the British Light-Heavyweight Championship. Later, when he returned to Canada, he became World Heavyweight Champion wrestler. He is presently the British Empire Wrestling Champion, and is regarded by most critics as Canada's outstanding wrestler.
