NEGOTIATIONS FOR PEACE.

The Supreme Crisis At Hand.

WAR PREPARATIONS IN TURKEY

ATHENS, May 4.—The Greek Government has recalled Colonel Vassos from Crete. He will be replaced in command of the Greek forces in the Island by Col. Staikas.
 The Greek cabinet sat in council from midnight on Saturday until yesterday (Monday) morning.
 It is evident that the supreme crisis of the war approaches. It is said on good authority that the Powers have made overtures to Greece on the subject of peace but the Government declines to invoke the mediation of Europe.
CONSTANTINOPLE, May 4.—In spite of the talk of peace, preparations for war show no signs of ceasing.
ROME, May 4.—Official despatches from Athens say that the Greek premier continues his negotiations with the view of securing the intervention of France, Russia and Great Britain in favor of an armistice.

NEWS FROM THE CAPITAL

Rights of Retiring Governments.
MR. MARTIN ADVOCATES ISLAND INTERESTS.

Queen's Birthday a Perpetual Holiday.

OTTAWA, May 4.—The chief topic in the House of Commons yesterday was the old question of the appointments submitted to the Governor-General before the retirement of the late Government.
 Sir Charles Tupper retains his opinion as to the unconstitutionality of the Governor-General's course. But he particularly desired to ask what the Government proposed to do about the appointments that the Governor-General had approved. Mr. Laurier had said last summer that these appointments would be respected. But some of those persons, so appointed, have not yet received a commission of any kind from the Government.
 Mr. Laurier replied that in cases where in action had been taken enquiry was being made as to the necessity of the appointment.
 Hon. Mr. Foster, who continued the discussion, thought that nine months was rather a long time for such an enquiry to continue.
 Mr. Martin, of Prince Edward Island, got the floor shortly before six o'clock and when the House adjourned, was dealing with the claims of his province for assistance to railway extensions.
 The bill making the Queen's Birthday a perpetual holiday went through.

TELEGRAPHIC NOTES.
LONDON, May 2.—The Devon & Exeter Gazette says that Adjutant General Sir Redvers Buller will succeed the Duke of Connaught in command of Aldershot camp; that Quartermaster General Evelyn Wood will succeed Sir Redvers Buller as Adjutant General, and that the Duke of Connaught will become quartermaster general of the British army.
 These appointments are likely to revive the criticism which raged at the time General Lord Frederick Roberts was passed over in favor of the Duke of Connaught for the Aldershot command, as Buller belongs to the Wolseley set.
 Sir Redvers Buller and Lord Wolseley were almost at sword's points a year ago over questions of military policy in India, as well as of promotions in the service.
CAPE COAST CASTLE, Gold Coast, Africa, May 2.—Grave news has been received here as to the mission of Lieut. Henderson, at Wa. It is reported that Chief Samoriu has attacked the mission. Authentic details have not yet been received, but a serious disaster is feared. The object of Lieut. Henderson was to make treaties with the chiefs in Hinterland. He had a large escort, but the governor of Lagos has been asked to send reinforcements.
 Ferguson, a colonial official who accompanied Lieut. Henderson, is known to be severely wounded.
LONDON, May 2.—The correspondent of the Daily Telegraph at Atkint has had an interview with Helen Constantinidis, the 15-year-old girl who is about to start for the front at the head of a large band of irregulars. She is an excellent shot. Her brother will accompany her. Both of them are bitterly anti-dynastic. She declares that she will fight in the front rank and has no fear of death. Her departure tonight (Sunday) was witnessed by thousands of enthusiastic Athenians who hail her as the Greek Joan of Arc.

MORE EARTHQUAKES.

A special despatch from Kingston, Ja., says there has been a succession of terrific earthquakes shocks in the Leeward Islands killing many people and doing great damage to property. The centre of the disturbance is at Montserrat, but the area affected extends from St. Kitts to Martinique. The greatest loss of life is at Guadeloupe. All business has been suspended and the churches have been opened for general prayer.
 A similar violent disturbance is reported from Lima, Peru; but no loss of life has been reported.
