12 Teachers Named For Vocational School

The new Prince County Vocational High School in Summerside will open in October with an excellent staff of 15, and 12 have already been appointed. It was learned yesterday from Hon. George Dewar, minister of education, that the staff will be on a par with any vocational high school in Canada, he stated. Some of the teachers are from out of the province.

"It is remarkable," Dr. Dewar added, "that have been able to get such a good staff. All provinces are having difficulty in getting qualified instructors."

70 Per Cent Taxes Collected S' Side Finance Report Shows

SUMMERSIDE — Slightly more than 70 per cent of the tax roll of \$50,382.00 has been reported by the finance committee at Monday night's meeting of town council, presided over by Mayor J. Ernest Morrison. All councillors were present.

Tax collections for amount to approximately \$38,000, the report stated, with collections generally holding up in the various revenue sections. However it was pointed out that items such as building permits which were budgeted in anticipation of the start of 273 homes, a "billions" worth of money, and that the collection of a new tax licenses require police attention.

Feeder Cattle Clearing House Is Being Sought

The Federation of Agriculture has been asked to act as a clearing house for feeder cattle sales in the province, it was learned Tuesday. The beef producers meeting here recently decided it would develop a clearing house with the hope of aiding feeder cattle sales in the province, and the federation has been asked to take on the responsibility. It will be discussed with the directors as soon as possible, it was learned from J.L. Dewar, federation secretary.

The clearing house idea would provide a place where cattle owners could list cattle they might have for sale.
