Oats and potatoes change hands at 28c and 16 to 17c, respectively. The movement is not very extensive.

The egg trade is pretty well over for the season. The buyers are paying 15½c for what are offering.

For dressed pork the price ranges from 4 to 4½, and there is a good deal on the move.

They are paying from 3 to 4c for live hogs at the factory.

Chickens range from 11 to 11½, and butter from 20 to 21c. The demand for butter is exceptionally good, and many orders cannot be filled.
