

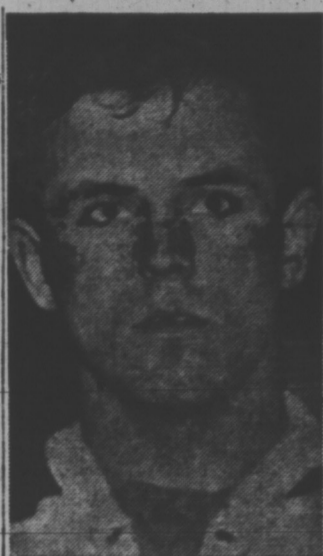
# Saints Come From Behind To Defeat Dalhousie 8-6

After two periods of inept and sloppy hockey, St. Dunstan's University Saints exploded for five goals in the third period to defeat Dalhousie University Tigers 8-6 in a Maritime Intercollegiate Hockey League game at the Varsity Arena Saturday.

Paul MacWilliams paced the Saints to victory scoring three goals and picking up one assist. All MacWilliams' goals came in the final 20 minutes, two of which were scored only 24 seconds apart. Mike Kelly and Rick O'Donnell each notched a pair of goals for SDU while Joe Cheverie rounded out the victors' scoring.

Dalhousie opened the game with a bang when Don MacPherson beat Saints' goalie Carl MacQuaid with a sharp angled shot at the 25 second mark of the opening period. The Tigers went ahead 2-0 at the 7:38 mark of the second period before Mike Kelly put the Saints on the scoreboard about two minutes later.

The Saints seemed to fall apart in the next few minutes as three quick goals by John Rogers, Doug Quackenbush, and

MacDonald sent the Tigers in front 5-1. However, the Saints rebounded with goals by Kelly and Cheverie to reduce the count to 5-3 by the end of the second frame.

Then the Saints took over. Hard-skating Rick O'Donnell narrowed the gap to one goal in the opening minutes of the final period on passes from Joe Cheverie and Allan Flood. MacWilliams soon scored two quick goals before Dal answered with Jim Levitz doing the honours, leaving the count 6-6.

At the 14:04 mark of the period Paul MacWilliams sent the Saints ahead for keeps on a pass from defenceman Vince Mulligan. O'Donnell notched an insurance marker after the Tigers had lifted their goalie in favor of a sixth attacker.

The Saints were not impressive throughout the contest and left much to be desired. Next Saturday the UNB Red Devils invade SDU campus and it will take a stronger all-round performance to come through with a win.

The Saints held a 40-28 shoot-

ing margin in the game, outshooting Dal in all three periods, including 14-9 in the first, and 13-5 in the second.

This was the Saints' first regular season game while the outcome left Dal with an 0-3 record.

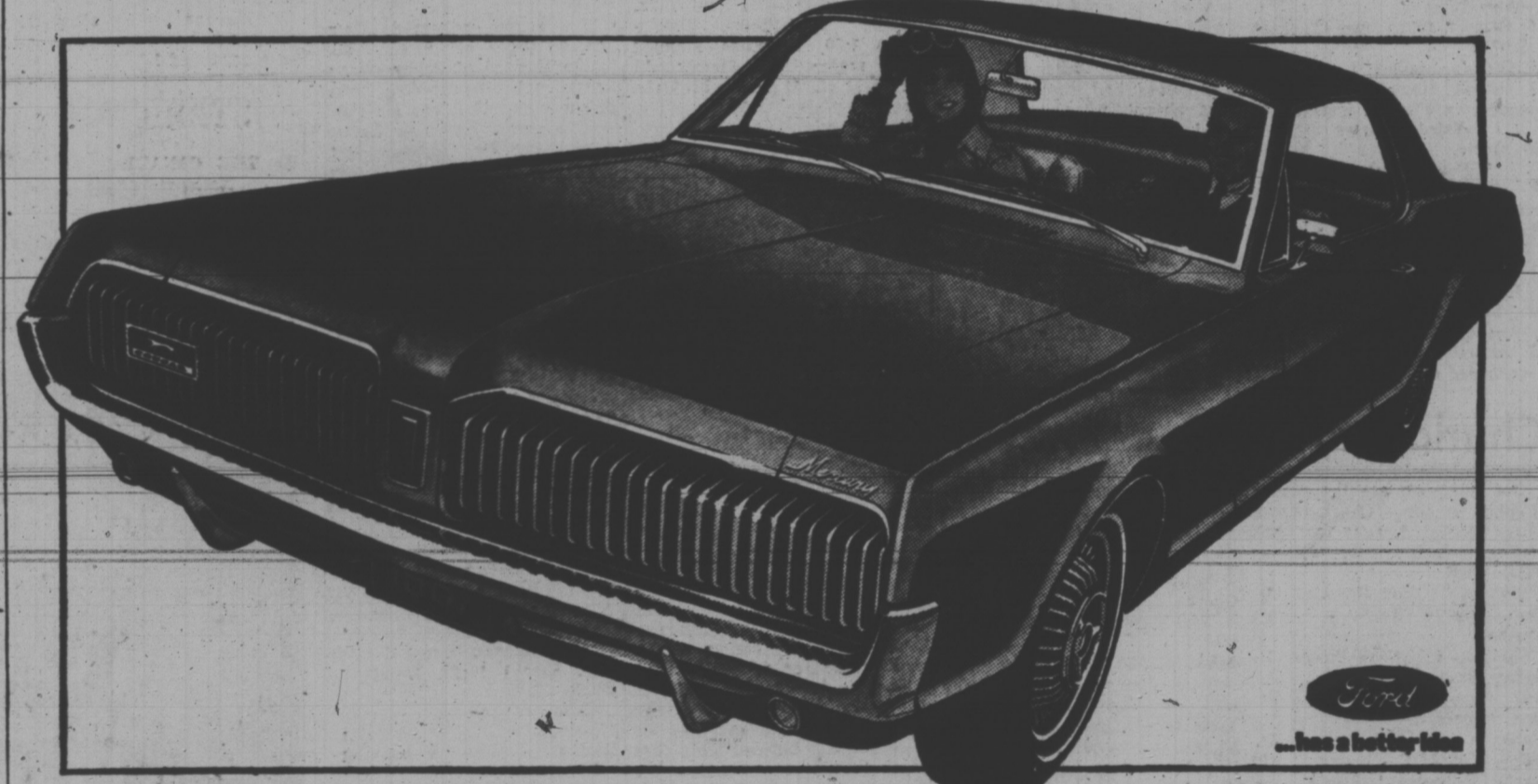

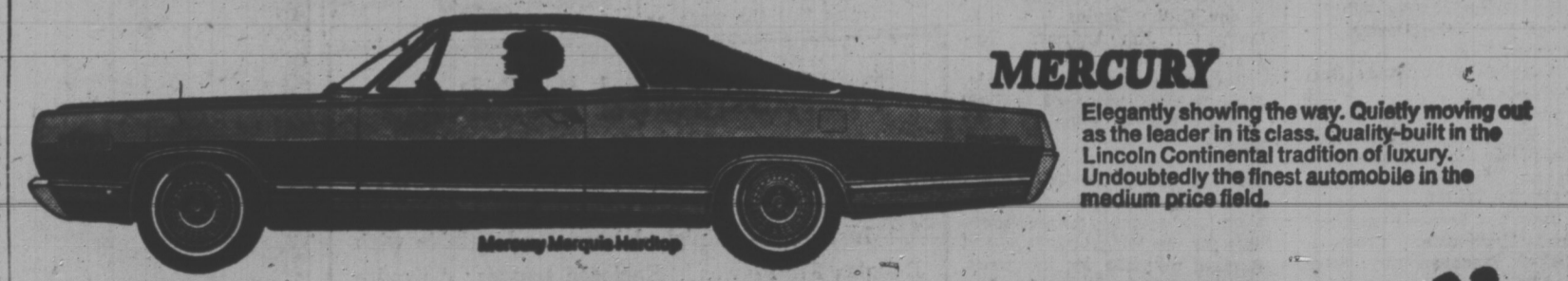

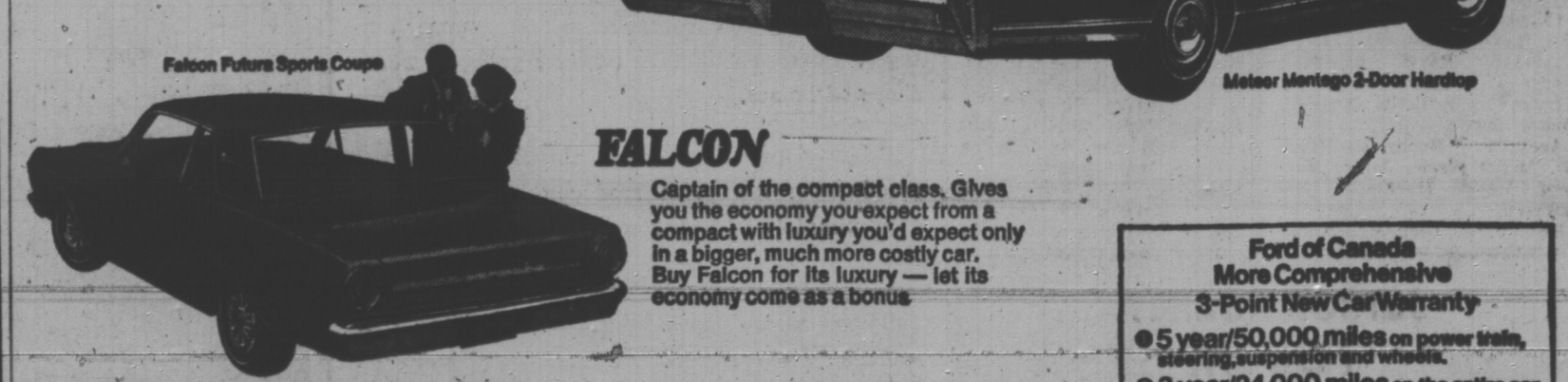

Three-goal performances by senior co-captain Jim Quinn of Somerville, Mass., and sophomore Serge Boily of Montreal paced the Terrier attack — five goals in the second period and four in the final.

UNB jumped off to a 1-0 lead at 11:23 of the first period on a goal by Bob Arnott. Boston tied the score at 3:27 of the second period when Boily collected his first of three.

The game went 2-1 in favor of the Terriers on Jim Quinn's goal at 7:10. But UNB tied it at 9:50 when Austin Duquette tallied on a power play.

Boston moved out in front to stay at 10:26 of the first period on Quinn's second goal and was never again threatened.

UNB goalie Mark Jacobson had a busy night with 48 saves while Boston's Wayne Ryan had 20 in 2 1/2 periods and Dave Cristofulli had four.

The Terriers defeated UNB 10-1 Friday night at Walpole, Mass.

## Huskies Win Invitational

HALIFAX (CP) — St. Mary's Huskies defeated Bloomfield, N.J., Deacons 93-90 in Halifax Sunday to capture the third annual St. Mary's University Invitational Basketball Tournament.

The tournament, originally scheduled to open Friday was delayed and finally cut to a two-game affair.

Weather conditions prevented a fourth entry, McMaster University of Hamilton, Ont. from flying to Halifax.

Bloomfield arrived in Halifax by charter plane shortly before taking to the floor against the Huskies who advanced to the final by defeating Mount Allison University Mounties of Sackville, N.B., 99-67 in a Saturday night contest.

Rick Dougherty led the Huskies against the U.S. team with 23 points. Jim Daniels added 22. Bloomfield's Bob Parsavage, voted the most valuable player of the tournament, scored 30.
