During the past year 9,242 cattle were either thrown overboard or died from injuries received in the passage across the Atlantic from leading American and Canadian ports.

The Chemist of the American Department of Agriculture is credited with saying that the fertility of the soil of the Western prairies will be exhausted sooner than that of the rocky land in the Eastern States.

Tennyson says that he meant to refer to Goethe in the much queried lines of "In Memoriam":

I held it truth with him who sings To one clear harp in divers tones, That men may rise on stepping stones Of their dead selves to higher things.

One of Brigham Young's sons is a teacher at West Point. He refused to quarrel over his father's property, was contented with a lot of railroad shares which the others assigned him, under the impression that they were worthless, and finds the property so valuable that he is extremely rich.

In accordance with ancient custom, the Lord Mayor of London has received from the Crown a present of four hucks from Windsor Park, and other city officials have been remembered. The viscountess had their origin in the guarantee to London citizens that their hunting in the royal parks and forests should be secured to them. This is one of the ancient formalities which seem trivial, but in an Englishman's eyes stand for the integrity of chartered rights.

In the twenty-eight factories of Central New York the Utica Herald figures that 5,020,000 cans are now in store to be filled with sweet corn as soon as that product can be picked, which is usually the first week of September. Contracts made have been at the rate of 35 cents per bushel of husked ears the prospect is that crops not thus engaged will command a higher price. The trade sales have been at \$2.25 to \$2.40 per case of two dozen cans, according to the size of the tins taken.

Dr. George Johnson has given an interesting list of articles of food and drink which should be used and avoided by those who do not wish to grow fat. Such persons may eat lean mutton and beef, veal and lamb, thin soups, beef tea, poultry, game, fish and eggs, bread in moderation, greens, cresses, lettuce, green peas, cabbage, cauliflower, onions and fresh fruit without sugar; but should abstain from fat meat, bacon, ham, butter, cream, sugar, potatoes, carrots, parsnips, rice, sago, tapioca, macaroni, custards, pastry, puddings and sweet cakes.

M. De Lesseps, in reply to a question as to whether the Suez Canal troubles were not what might occur with the Panama Canal, said: "No; Americans have never interfered in matters that do not concern them, while it has been the invariable practice for England to be always meddling in other people's affairs. No; I have no apprehension that Panama will ever hear cannon fired." M. De Lesseps said the work on the Panama Canal is progressing favorably, and is being pushed forward with the greatest activity.

The ladies of Tibet; before appearing in public, make themselves hideous by daubing their faces with different colors. The custom was established by a royal decree issued about 200 years ago, when licentiousness prevailed to a frightful extent in that country. It is said to have had a marked effect on the morals of the people. Most Oriental women cultivate fatness. They also daub their finger and toe nails with a coating that looks like red mud, and dock their hair, and destroy their teeth by smoking and eating bionens. It is not an uncommon thing for them to blacken their teeth on purpose.

A correspondent to the Chronicle says that the recent Y. M. C. A. convention at Truro a few weeks ago has had a wholesome effect on the people generally. This will be admitted to be gratifying, as, whether rightly or wrongly, an impression generally prevails that Truro is no better than it should be. If the convention has had a purifying and elevating influence, all true friends of morality will rejoice. Truro ought to be a good place. Nature has been prolific in her favor. The people are generally prosperous in the sense of possessing this world's goods. Churches abound. Eloquent preachers are not scarce. But, according to many reports, the vital spirit of Christianity is absent.

The fertility of resource of the newspaper press of Winnipeg was strikingly illustrated by the publication last week of a circumstantial telegraphic account of the English attack upon Arabi's entrenchment, in which great valor was displayed by the Irish battalions who led the assault and who were cheered on by the Scotch regiments. In the affray the Irishmen were reported to have used their fists to good purpose in knocking down the Egyptians and then clubbing their brains out with the butts of their rifles. The whole story was concocted in the press rooms of the evening paper, and was published to see if the morning paper would copy it. The ruse was not successful.

The Slaughter of the Beetle.

A profound sensation will be created in insect circles on the other side of the Atlantic, says the St James Gazette, of London, by the melancholy fate that has befallen the Colorado beetle discovered a few days ago secreted as a "stowaway" on board the Union steamship Wisconsin at Liverpool. On the fact being reported to the Privy Council directions were given that the beetle should be at once put to death and its body forwarded to Whitehall for inspection. The sentence has no doubt by this time been carried out, and the remains of the beetle are probably at this very moment on their way to the Privy Council Office. It will, of course, be thought by many benevolent persons that the beetle has been hardly dealt with. A sentence of imprisonment for life would, it may be urged, have met the justice of the case; and the slaughter of the beetle in cold blood is a proceeding that cannot be justified even on grounds of expediency. On the other hand, it may be taken for granted that the execution of the beetle was not decided on without grave consideration. Its escape from confinement might have been attended by the most serious consequences, and even our present Ministry could hardly afford to adopt a policy of conciliation in dealing with Colorado beetles.

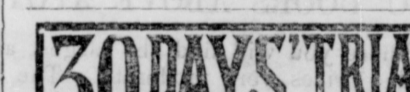
