Milk and Electricity Within the next year two large dairy plants will go into operation and these plants will provide a market for large quantities of fluid milk which must be of reasonably good quality. The rapid cooling of milk is a prime essential for good quality and the farm which has power available is in a preferred position to put up a quality article. The farmer without electricity will either result in lower returns for his product or force upon him the necessity of more laborious methods of cooling the milk. From the standpoint of quality the problem of the new dairy plant can most satisfactorily be handled by the general provision of power. Federation Meetings The directors of the three County Federations will be holding meetings this week and next to make plans for school district and County annual meetings in November. Up for consideration will be rural electrification, accident insurance, Farm Forum, and the mechanics of licensing potato growers. There is room for improvement in the Federation interest at the school district level and every effort must be made to get a turnout and increased activity on the part of the officers. Farm Forum On Monday night Farm Forums meet for the first time this season to discuss the pros and cons of "Farming As A Career". No doubt the discussion will bring out the disadvantages and advantages of farm life, but we are hoping that attention will be focused on the advantages which in too many cases have been only dimly realized.
