MIAMI BEACH, Fla. (AP)—
Elliott Roosevelt, newly elected
mayor of Miami Beach, says
his major goal will be to wipe
out the city's image as a tour-
ist resort whose permanent re-
sidents are pensioners. He prom-
ised federal housing for young
families. Roosevelt, 54, second
son of the late President Frank-
lin D. Roosevelt, was sworn in
a 1,400-vote margin Tuesday in
his second successful venture
into politics. He was elected a
Democratic national commit-
tee member from Florida in 1964.
