THE FIGHT AT RICHMOND.

The tactics of the Confederates in the war now being waged in the United States have undoubtedly proved superior to those of the Federals. Though unable to meet the Federals on the open ground, on the water, and on the rivers wherever navigable, their land forces in the interior have unquestionably established their superiority. At first the Confederates succeeded in driving the Federals from the forts and the subsequent operations have proved that these movements, however much they may have depreciated the prowess of the South in the eyes of the world, were necessary to the successful accomplishment of its independence. What the Confederates lacked in numbers has been fully made up by skilful generalship, determined courage, desperate energy, and a thorough knowledge of the terrain in which they were called upon to fight. On many trying occasions these varied qualities have proved of essential service, but at no time or in no position have they proved of so great advantage as in the recent contest before Richmond. The unquestionable defeat which the Federals sustained in the seven days' fighting, and the immense sacrifice of human life which resulted therefrom, might, in some respects, be regarded as the display of that military genius which so essentially pertains to a great commander. Though placed in adverse circumstances, it cannot be denied that the Federals fought heroically, and in a manner to contrast favorably with the enemy. Every attack of the enemy was, as all the accounts admit, bravely met; and though at times the men were literally mowed down, the retreat was accomplished with the greatest order. If the Federal troops so distinguished themselves when improperly led, what might not have been accomplished had their movements been directed by a man possessed of that military genius so often ascribed to McClellan? It is a fact that the movement has clearly proved him to be a military genius. It has been said that the retreat of McClellan's army to the position now occupied was a masterpiece of strategy, and a doubtless it was. It does it not prove that the plan of operations which left this as the army's sole resort was faulty? Why did McClellan encamp his army around and on the main roads, if he were other positions from which he could operate more successfully? The answer is plain. McClellan expected that by the time he established a position in the vicinity of Richmond, other branches of the Federal army would be marching in cooperation with him, and then at one fell swoop the Confederate forces would be annihilated, and the rebellion crushed. In all his arrangements, however, he made no provision for the contingency—1. A defeat, and 2. A retreat.
