MRS. JOHN T. MULLIGAN

It was with great sorrow and a keen sense of loss that the citizens of Kinkora and the surrounding districts received news of the sudden death of Mrs. John T. Mulligan (nee Rosella Hughes) a highly respected citizen and greatly loved parishioner of that community and Parish.

Although not in robust health for some time she nevertheless was able with the help of her family to look after her household up to the time of her death which occurred very suddenly due to a heart attack on the morning of April 21st.

The attack was so sudden and she was stricken so severely that there was no time to summon medical aid. She, however, lived long enough to receive the last rites of Holy Mother, the Church administered by her pastor, Rev. Fr. Croken who was hastily summoned to her bedside. And so, surrounded by her grief-stricken husband and those of her family who were within reach and fortified by the rites of her church her gentle soul went forth to meet its maker to reap the reward of a truly Christian life.

The late Mrs. Mulligan, who was in her seventy-second year was a daughter of the late James Hughes and Ellen Berrigan of Thistle and Shamrock.

In 1905 she married John T. Mulligan an energetic and highly respected blacksmith of Middleton where a few years later they moved to a small farm in the village of Kinkora, where they lived ever since.

Mrs. Mulligan was of a kind and cheerful disposition. Her husband's trade naturally brought many to their home and although engrossed in the many and detailed cares and duties of wife and mother her kindness and genial hospitality never failed.

She was a devoted member of her church and was ever ready and willing to aid and contribute to any worthy cause. She will long be remembered by both young and old as a generous, kind and devoted lady blessed with the sterling qualities of charity, patience, honesty and above all devotion to her God and solicitous care for her husband and family.

She will be sorely missed in the parish and community, but naturally it is in the home which she fostered and where she devoted her lifetime to being a dutiful wife and a loving mother where she will be most sorely missed and where she will still live on in the hearts and memories of her sorrowing husband, sons and daughters.

There are left to mourn besides her aging husband, six sons and one daughter. They are: Joseph L. of Thistle and Shamrock; Everett, Keith and Preston of Kinkora; John Emmett, Clayhurst, B. C., who flew home to attend the funeral; and Helen (Mrs. Pius Smith) of Charlottetown.

There are also seven grandchildren who will greatly miss her.

One daughter, Bernadette, predeceased her seven years ago.

The funeral which was very largely attended was held from her late residence on Saturday, April 23rd, at St. Malachias Church, Kinkora, where Requiem High Mass was sung by the pastor, Rev. Harold Croken who also conducted the service at the grave side.

The pallbearers were her neighbours P. L. Morris, J. W. Farmer, Ralph McCarville, Maurice Berrigan, Aloisius Roberts, Sabinus Johnson.

The large list of Mass Cards, Sympathy Letters and Messages of Sympathy testify to the high esteem in which the deceased was held.

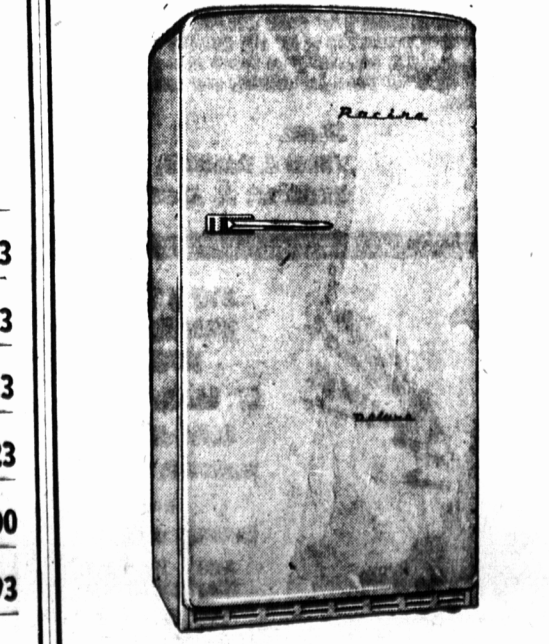

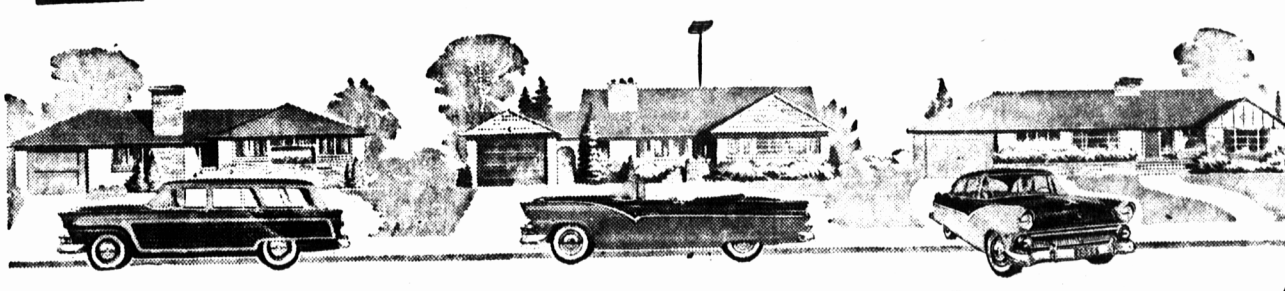

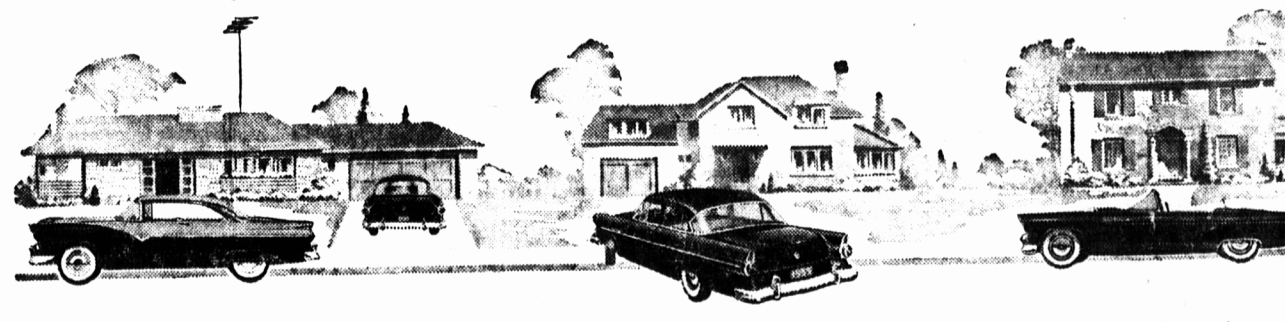
