On the coastal plain of North Carolina there are hundreds of depressions all lined up in a north-west-south-east direction. These basins are called "Bays" because of the trees growing in them and the Bays are anything up to a mile in length. They are shallow with the deepest part at the south-end; and nearly all contain water. A few are filled up with vegetable matter. They give the map a peculiar pock-marked appearance. A bold theory has been advanced that these lakes were formed by a shower of meteorites, perhaps at the time of the great Arizona meteorite, described in this column a few weeks ago.
