In honor of the special occasion a "Miss 1887", appropriately dressed in the costume of that period, will carry in a huge birthday cake and will personally serve at the past presidents' table.

SPECIAL ATTENTION

Also due for special attention are all those new members who joined the board as a result of their membership drive recently. They will be given special individual introductions to the gathering.

Here as guests for the occasion will be Fred W. Dickinson, Hartland, N.B., president of the Maritime Provinces Board of Trade, and A.T. Parkes, Moncton, executive secretary, who are arriving in the city today.

One of the outstanding Maritime figures in both community and military service will be the guest speaker for the dinner tonight.

He is Brig. G.G. Anglin, C.B.E. MC and Bar, BCL, of Saint John, N.B., who will speak on "The Board of Trade Today". Brigadier Anglin is a native of Montreal, but has lived most of his life in the Maritimes. He received his education at Mount Allison University and McGill where he obtained his degree as Bachelor of Law.

He served in the First World War with the 26th Battalion and twice was awarded the Military Cross. In the Second World War he was district officer commanding military district No. 7 and was the original chairman N.B.—P.E.I. Division, of the Corps of Commissioners.

In civilian life he is president of Eastern Bakers' Ltd., and is a past president of both the Saint John and the Maritime Boards of Trade. He has been a director of Atlantic Provinces Economic Council since its formation in 1951. His home now is in Rothesay, N.B.

The next past president to Mr. Cotton in point of service is Mr. Justice George J. Tweedy who held office in 1931. Also present will be Wallace L. Higgins who joined the Board of Trade as secretary in 1918.

of the board, headed by president G.G.K. Peake, will receive their guests at a reception in the lounge at which the Maritime Central Airways will be hosts.

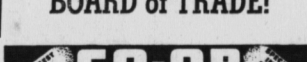

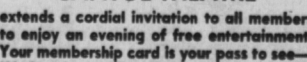

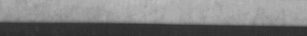
