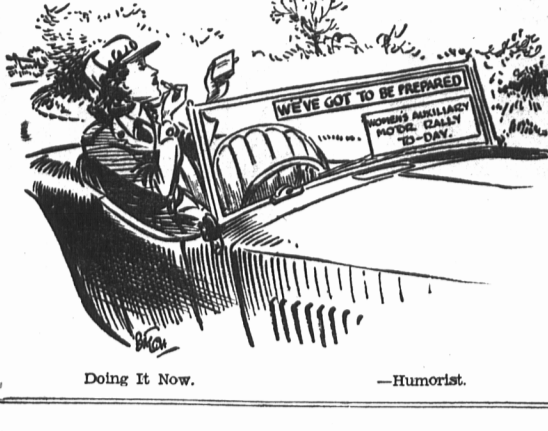

again unchanged while Quebec No. 2
added five cents. The price to cream-
ery of Quebec pasteurized
butter delivered in Montreal for
current make dipped 1-8 cent while
the price of cheese to factory de-
livered in Montreal for current
make held steady.

Job price of first grade creamery
butter prints was 22 1/4-3/4 and
of first grade solids 21 3/4-2 1/4.
Western butter delivered in Mon-
real was unquoted. Price to cream-
ery of Quebec No 1 pasteurized
butter delivered in Montreal for
current make was 20 3/4 and Que-
bec No. 2 pasteurized butter
prices was 19 3/4.

Price to factory of Ontario white
cheese delivered in Montreal for
current make was 10 7/16-11 1/16
and colored 10 5/8-11 1/16. Quebec
