### City Magistrate Answers Criticism

Magistrate A. J. Haslam, QC, said at the end of City Police Court Saturday morning that "contrary to some accusations that the police run the court, the police present their case just like the defendant. I give my own judgment not that of the police."

Magistrate Haslam's statement followed criticism made at the Oct. 19 meeting of city council, when Councillor Allison M. Gillis said that the city magistrate "does whatever the police tell him," and that he was not sufficiently familiar with the laws of criminal evidence to fulfill his duties properly.

The following cases were heard by Magistrate Haslam at the Saturday sitting of court: William Bruce MacCallum, Charlottetown, charged with assault and Adrian Bagloe, Charlottetown, charged with being drunk and disorderly were each fined \$20 and costs or five days. A third accused was given 20 days and a sixth was remanded until Oct. 28.

Vernon Ford was dismissed due to lack of evidence. Earl Campbell, Charlottetown, charged with vagrancy was remanded until Oct. 31. There were six cases of drunk and incapable. Two of the accused were each fined \$10 and costs or five days. A third accused was fined \$20 and costs or 30 days and a fourth \$30 and costs or 10 days. A sixth accused was given 20 days and a sixth was remanded until Oct. 28.

### Unemployment Payments Due In Cheque Form

OTTAWA (CP) — Unemployment insurance benefit payments, now made partly in cash and partly by mailed cheques, will soon be handled entirely by cheque, the Commons public accounts committee was told here.

Electronic computers to issue cheques have been installed in the Winnipeg unemployment insurance office as a pilot measure. The system will be expanded as soon as it is feasible. J. R. Douglas, an official of the auditor — general's office, gave the information to the committee.

### UF Total Still Below Appeal Quota

At the end of last week, an estimated 75 per cent of Prince Edward Island's United Fund Appeal quota of \$258,483 had been raised. It was reported. The official closing date of the United Fund Appeal, was Oct. 30. President of the campaign, Frank MacDonald, said, "we didn't make it and we must keep going and try and make our quota." Mr. MacDonald said he hoped this is accomplished by the end of this month.

A spokesman said that a survey showed the payroll division of the United Appeal reported an increase in nearly every department, compared to last year. Four regional high school districts have topped the 100 per cent mark for individual quotas; three districts were over 90 per cent and one district "reached 75 per cent of its quota.

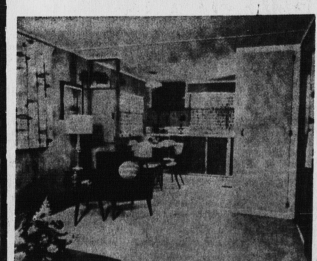

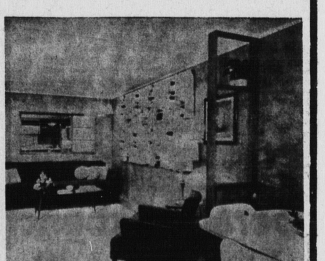
