To Keep Plants Moist

Here is a way to keep a plant moist for several days without watering. Set a bowl of water above the level of the plant.

Cook's Corner

CHILI SAUCE

Three quarts (measured after coring and peeling) chopped ripe tomatoes, 1 1/2 cups each chopped onion, chopped sweet green pepper, chopped sweet red pepper, 2 cups chopped celery, 3 cups chopped celery (using outer stalks is alright), 2/3 cup brown sugar, 2 teaspoons each cinnamon, mustard, nutmeg, 2 cups vinegar, 2 tablespoons salt.
