The Society met weekly with a membership of twenty-four active and four honorary members, the average attendance being eighteen.

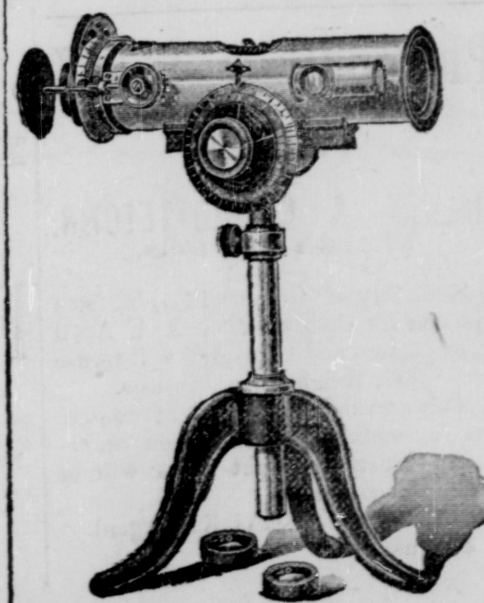
