

MR. PATRICK MURRAY

The community of Lot 65 and surrounding districts were deeply saddened and profoundly shocked to hear on the eve of August 10th, 1955, of the sudden death by car accident of a life long resident of that place in the person of Mr. Patrick Murray.

The late Mr. Murray was born in Tyrone, Lot 65 in 1883 and lived his entire life there, with the exception of a few months of last year which he spent with his daughter in Saint John.

A man of integrity and honesty, he possessed a cheerful and humorous disposition. "Pat," as he was familiarly known, was a favorite, especially with his grandchildren, in whose company he spent a pleasant winter in Saint John, N. B. Those who were privileged to live near him, knew what a kind friend and neighbor he was, as he was always ready and willing to lend a helping hand.

He was attentive to Church and community affairs, and no one enjoyed a friendly game of cards more than "Pat."

His home was a hospitable one and a host of friends will regret his sudden tragic passing, but no one will miss his gentle presence more than his sons Cecil and James with whom he lived.

Surviving him are his only daughter Teresa, Mrs. Mack Costello, Saint John, N. B.; four sons, namely: Vincent in Halifax, Basil in Saint John, N. B., Cecil and James at home. One son Lawrence was killed while serving in the air force.

His funeral, which was very largely attended was under the direction of Robert Bradley and was held to St. Ann's Church, Lot 65 on August 13th, 1955, where Requiem High Mass was offered by his nephew Rev. Eugene Murray, Pastor of Summerfield.

The pall bearers were Vincent McCloskey, Amos Callaghan, Peter Clarkin, Peter Trainor, Frank Egan and Amos Malone.
