N. S. Plans To Revolutionize Teacher Training, Raise Status Of Profession

HALIFAX (CP) — Education Minister Henry Hicks said Tuesday Nova Scotia will pay the tuition of student teachers as part of a plan that will revolutionize teacher training and raise the status of the profession in the province.

OTTAWA, (CP)—Spokesmen for all opposition parties in the Commons expressed general approval Tuesday of a bill to set up federal-provincial allowances for the totally and permanently disabled.
