## CHINA MAKES A CONCESSION

### Allowing Extension of a French Settlement,

SIR CLAUDE MacDONALD'S PRO-TESTS WERE IGNORED.

The Chinese Viceroy Disappointed  
With the British.

[SPECIAL TO THE EXAMINER.]

LONDON, Dec. 31.—The Shanghai correspondent of the Times says it is officially asserted that, in spite of the protests of Sir Claude MacDonald, China has acceded to the demands for an extension of an exclusive French settlement in Shanghai.

This is due to pressure exerted at Peking and is likely to hamper negotiations for the extension of the cosmopolitan settlement.

The Viceroy is greatly chagrined at the failure of Great Britain to support his determined policy in the valley of the Yang Tee Kiang at an important crisis.

A French View.

PARIS, December 30.—The Matin this morning says: France would probably be inclined to renounce all right along the Newfoundland French shore, but the compensation for renouncing must be large, since renunciation would entail the loss of French sovereignty in the islands of St. Pierre and Miquelon.

A PROPOSITION MADE FOR France.

LONDON, Dec 31.—There is no reason to believe that the French government contemplates making any proposition regard-French shore rights in Newfoundland.
