DEATH NOTICE

EDWARD P. DONNELLY The death occurred at the Charlottetown Hospital on Friday, April 13th, 1959, of Edward P. Donnelly, 34 Gerald Street, Charlottetown, in his sixty-fourth year.

The deceased spent over a year in Sunnybrook Hospital, Toronto, where he underwent surgery and returned home in December but his condition worsened and he was obliged to enter the Charlottetown Hospital on December 26th.

On the above mentioned date, despite the best medical skill, and fortified by the last rites of the Roman Catholic Church and with his family by his bedside, the soul that had labored so faithfully in his life passed to its eternal reward.

The late Mr. Donnelly a veteran of World War One was born at Peake's Station, a son of the late Frank Donnelly and Mary Ellen Connelly.

After his return from overseas he spent some time in Halifax and later in Lawrence, Mass., where he was employed at Electric Work. Later he returned to his native province where he spent most of his remaining years. In 1945 he established his own electrical business in Charlottetown. His jovial and kind disposition won for him a host of friends who will long cherish his memory.

He has left us the noble example of a truly Christian man and to his family a priceless heritage, the training and example of a good father. His wife predeceased him twelve years ago.

Left to mourn are four sons and two daughters, namely: Vernon Northern Ontario, Elwood, Toronto, Sheldon and Gerard, Charlottetown. Mrs. Ernest Doyle, Savage Harbour and Eileen at home. Also two grandchildren, two sisters, and two brothers.

The funeral was held on Monday morning, April 13, from his late residence to St. Dunstan's Basilica, where Requiem High Mass was celebrated by Rev. Clarence Roche who also conducted the service at the grave. Rev. Eric Robin, P.P. of Morrell, was present in the sanctuary.
