FACIAL PARALYSIS (BELL'S Palsy) NOT PERMANENT PARALYSIS

Some years ago I noticed a university student whose face was pulled all to one side. There were no symptoms present at the time—no lameness or other sign of paralysis—so I suspected Bell's palsy.

It often develops when the victim is feeling perfectly well and evidence of general infection is seldom found, though the palsy often follows an infection of nose and throat.

The disease usually takes one of two courses: (1) Recovery begins within one to three weeks and is complete in four to six weeks. This shows a passing or temporary block of the facial nerve.

"Treatment can be effective only if started within a few hours after onset of the palsy," the doctors tell us.
