Brazilian Affairs.

LONDON, Nov. 18. Dr. Barbosa, the new Brazilian minister of Finance, has telegraphed the Brazilian minister here that the government has been constituted as the United States of Brazil; the monarchy had been deposed and Dom Pedro and family have left the country.

Rio Janeiro, Nov. 18.

Dom Pedro and the Imperial family left yesterday for Lisbon in the steamer Alagos. Senator Patrocinio has been imprisoned for conspiracy against the Republic.

OTTAWA, Nov. 15. Commander Gordon has returned from Washington. He and Captain Johnson, of Gloucester, were the only witnesses examined on the adoption of sound signals by fishing vessels.

Vagaries of the Tides.

QUEBEC, Nov. 18. The vagaries of the tides here for the past two days are occupying the attention of mariners. The water, it seems, is lower than the oldest inhabitants can remember.

Mormon Matters.

WINNIPEG, Nov. 18. A number of leading Mormons from Salt Lake are at present visiting the Mormon settlement near McLeod. The party consists of President Woodruff, the present head of the Mormon Church, George G. Cannon, who represents Utah in Congress, Brigham Young, Jr. and Mr. Smith, a nephew of J. Smith.

Halifax Notes.

HALIFAX, Nov. 18. The schooner Ocean Belle, 83 tons, sails for Victoria, B. C., to-morrow to engage in the seal fisheries. A heavy catch of mackerel was reported from along the shore to-day.

The West Lambton Election.

TORONTO, Nov. 18. Charles MacKenzie, Liberal, has been elected for West Lambton, by 560 majority. Mr. McRae, the equal rights' candidate, polled between five and six hundred votes.

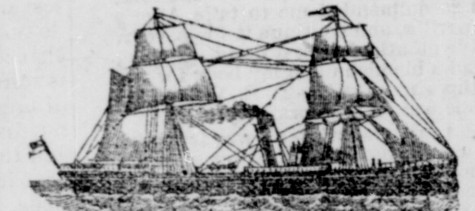

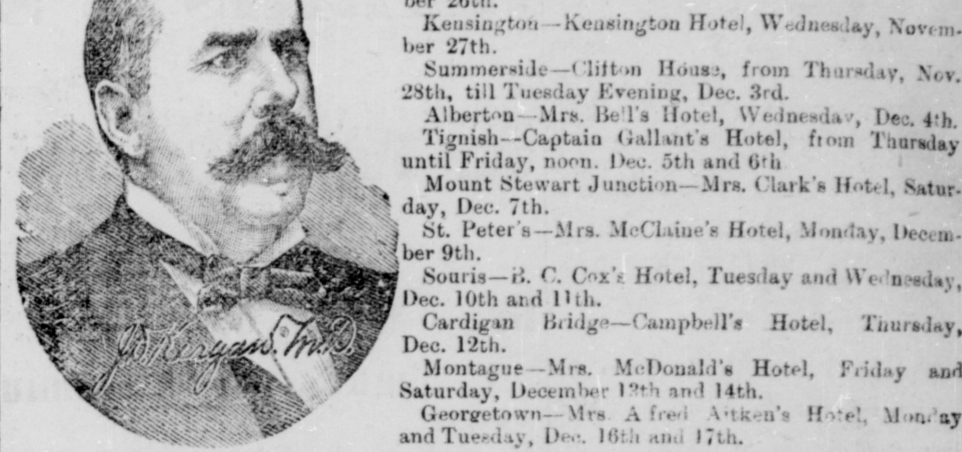
