Hays Is Strong Advocate Of Crop Insurance Policy

OTTAWA—Agriculture minister Harry Hays may be on the verge of creating a minor revolution in federal agricultural policies. Often criticized for absence from the Commons Mr. Hays is displaying a strong stubborn streak which could lead to a revamping of federal aid in farm crises.

Almost from the day he took over the portfolio in 1963, Mr. Hays has been an advocate of crop insurance. Because such insurance depends on a tripartite agreement between federal and provincial governments and the individual farmer, Mr. Hays has run into difficulties.

At the moment, only the three prairie provinces and Prince Edward Island have instituted crop insurance plans. But the neophyte Calgary politician has been applying pressure to bring three other provinces into the fold—Ontario, Quebec and British Columbia.

The pressure Mr. Hays can apply occurs when disaster strikes crops. This year it was drought in parts of Ontario and Quebec and a severe winter which killed fruit trees in British Columbia. All three provinces approached the federal government for direct financial assistance to hard-hit farmers and orchardists.

The federal minister agreed to give assistance but in each case has coupled it with a not-so-subtle demand that the provinces guard against future disasters by entering crop insurance. Ontario and Quebec have agreed to explore the possibility, but premier W. A. C. Bennett of B.C. still needs convincing. The result is that no federal

Chartered Banks, Railways Rejected On Labor Code Plea

OTTAWA (CP)—Five chartered banks and three railways have been turned down in their bids for temporary exemption from the \$1.25-an-hour minimum wage provision of the Canada Labor Code, informants said here.

They are the first of many decisions on deferment applications expected to be handed down in the coming months by Labor Minister MacEachen.

The first rejections affect about 5,500 workers—employees of CNB hotels, maintenance workers at five banks and messengers of the CNR, CPR and

operations, and informants said he intends to adopt a "tough" approach on other applications.

In the case of the railways, he was committed to carrying out the labor code's provisions in all government departments and Crown corporations.

The CNR hotels named in the application were the Newfoundland in St. John's, the Nova Scotia in Halifax, the Chateau Laurier in Ottawa, the Fort Garry in Winnipeg, the Bessborough in Saskatoon, the Macdonald in Edmonton and Jasper Park Lodge in Alberta.

The five banks which applied for deferment, mainly for maintenance employees, are the Bank of Nova Scotia, the Banque Provinciale du Canada, the Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce, the Royal Bank of Canada and the Toronto-Dominion Bank.
