INDIVIDUAL COMMUNION CUPS.

The question of individual communion cups came before the Presbyterian Synod of the Maritime Provinces during its session in St. John, and as already announced in our telegrams it was referred to the General Assembly.

The question was brought up on the appeal of Rev. Donald McNeill of Zion Church, Charlottetown, against the decision of the Presbytery of P. E. Island.

Rev. A. McLean Sinclair was heard on behalf of the Presbytery, but declined to express an opinion for or against individual cups.

Rev. Dr. Macrae moved that the appeal be dismissed and the Presbytery's action sustained.

Dr. Sedgwick moved, seconded by Dr. Gordon, that the Presbytery's decision be recalled.

Dr. Falconer argued that the Scriptures gave no minute instructions as to the Lord's Supper, and held it was not clear that only one cup was originally used.

Dr. Sedgwick rejoined, urging his motion to recall the action of the Presbytery of P. E. Island.

Principal Pollock of the Presbyterian College, Halifax, pointed out that liberty to use individual cups would disturb the uniformity of administering the communion.

too many innovations, and he would support Dr. Sedgwick's amendment.

Rev. J. McGregor McKay moved an amendment to the amendments, that the use of the individual cup be referred to the General Assembly.

Rev. Eben Miller of Yarmouth thought the reasons advanced for the individual cup did not carry much weight.

Rev. Dr. Murray of New Glasgow strongly opposed "the solitary cup" because it was opposed to unity and was the symbol of separation.

The vote was then taken on Dr. Sedgwick's amendment, which was in effect that the appeal be sustained and the Presbytery's decision recalled.

Rev. J. McGregor McKay then moved that the question be referred to the General Assembly.

It will be seen that so far as expression of opinion and preference went the individual cup received but scanty support among the speakers who discussed the question.
