Summer Festival Signs Kate Reid

The Charlottetown Festival has announced the signing of Kate Reid for two roles in its 1966 "Festival of Music and Laughter".

The Canadian actress will play the mayor's wife, Anna, in Mavor Moore's "The Ottawa Man", and Captain Crashaw, M.D., Ph.D., R.C.A.M.C., C.W.A.C. in "The Adventures of Private Turvey", a new musical by Donald Harron and Norman Campbell, based on the novel by Earle Birney. Both are comedy roles, and in "Turvey" the actress will have her first opportunity as a singer. In addition she is expected to star in a special entertainment at the Festival cabaret.

Miss Reid will go into rehearsal June 20 for her Charlottetown Festival roles. Her contract with the Festival includes transportation to Charlottetown for a cat, a dog, her two children and her housekeeper. She plans to rent a huge old stone house within walking distance of the theatre.

In "The Ottawa Man" she will appear with Donald Harron and Eric House "Turvey", to be staged and choreographed by Alan Lund, will star Jack Duffy and include the entire Charlottetown Festival Repertory Company.

Premier nights are July 6 ("Ottawa Man") and July 25 ("Turvey"). The two shows will run in repertory with "Anne of Green Gables" until September 3.

Mounties Annual Parade Is Scheduled For Sunday

The 93rd anniversary of the formation of the Force will be celebrated tomorrow morning as the RCMP 'L' Division stages its seventh annual church parade in this city.

Approximately 50 members of the famed police will be here from all detachments in the province to take part in the event. He retires next Wednesday, May 25.

The proclamation bringing the old North West Mounted Police into being was staged on May 23, 1873, by Sir John A. Macdonald, famed Canadian statesman of the Confederation era. Heading the parade will be Superintendent A.S. McNeil who will be performing his last official public function with the service of which he has been a member for 35 years. A native of Winnipeg and former football player with Regina Rough Riders he was noted as a traffic expert in his branch of the service. He retires next Wednesday, May 25.

The parade tomorrow morning will form at 10:20 on Grafton Street, opposite Confederation Centre, and led by the P.E.I. Regiment Band will move off down Grafton at 10:30. An eyes
