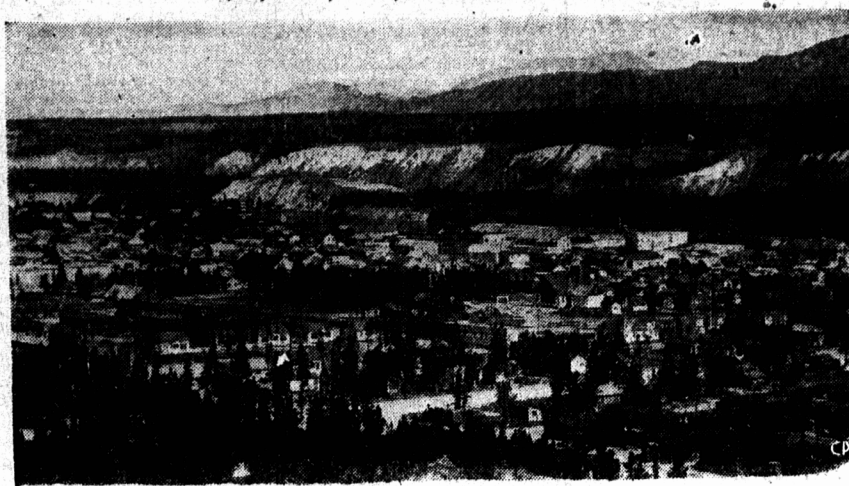

Canadians Provide Money For Economic Development

NEW YORK, (CP)—Since the end of the war the savings needed to finance Canada's economic development have been provided from within the country itself, Louis Rasminsky, executive assistant to the governor of the Bank of Canada said Tuesday.

The Canadian economist said that since the war ended "Canada has devoted a very high proportion of its output to the expansion of its productive capacity without, on balance, importing capital from outside the country."

Rasminsky's address, delivered before a Town Hall meeting, was on "The Canadian Dollar."

He told the big New York forum of industrial and business executives that foreign demand for Canadian dollars increased sharply because foreigners wanted to step up their buying of goods and services from Canada, and because they wanted to invest their money in Canadian resource development and in Canadian long-term security offerings.

On the other hand, Canadian demand for foreign currencies rose only slightly.

"The result was a bidding up of the exchange rate to a point where additional supplies of Canadian dollars were tempted onto the market," he said.

The economist found Canada's ability to finance its own development "a rather astonishing fact."

In most periods of rapid economic growth Canada had a weak balance of payments on current account, buying more goods and services from abroad than she sold, and paying for the balance out of large receipts of investment capital from outside Canada.

But, "for the post-war period as a whole the sums Canadians invested, loaned or repaid abroad more than offset the total inflow of capital into Canada from other countries."

NEW YORK, (AP)—The stock market pointed up last week toward a 1952-53 high. At the end of the week it stood only a short distance away from a record.

All week the stock market displayed surprising resistance to unexpected news, and at the same time it capitalized fully on all the good news it could find.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks gained \$1.20 on the week, the third best weekly advance this year, and it closed at \$115, only \$150 away from the high for 1952-53 established last

Jan. 5. But the very fact that the market is up again in that high level is giving trouble. Those who accumulated stocks at these peak prices stand ready to sell in many instances as soon as their stock shows a profit.

Canadian stocks were mixed Friday. Dome Mines gained, 1-8 and International Nickel added 1-2 to 45 3-4; Canadian Pacific and McIntyre both lost 1-4.

On the American stock exchange, Giant Yellowknife eased 1-8.
