Their journey through the 50-foot channel at the northern tip of the continent established an escape route eastward for ships which otherwise might be trapped by Arctic icepacks.  
At the eastern exit of the strait, commanding officers of the ships signed a message reporting on their journey and left it in a cairn near Fort Rose, Somerset Island.  
The Canadian ship, the Labrador, led the way in overcast weather and the three U.S. vessels followed through the calm water of the strait, the navy reported. They found only occasional scattered ice during the one-hour and 20 minute passage, completed Friday.
